Supervisor Barger:

Pasadena Latinos are not receiving their fair share of COVID vaccination shots. As of March 30, according to Pasadena's own "COVID-19 Dashboard", 43% of Asians have been inoculated but less than 21% of Hispanics have been inoculated. Pasadena's Director of Public Health Ying-Ying Goh has obviously prioritized Asians over Latinos. Ying-Ying Goh has also unethically allocated vaccination supply by race, providing at least one Black organization with exclusive access to vaccine while denying it to others. Ying-Ying Goh has even proudly announced she was making medical and public health decisions by race.

As of March 22, it is the official policy of Pasadena to "root out systemic racism" which means that City government is taking action to enforce Critical Race Theory which states that all white people are racist and perpetuate a racist system in Pasadena and as a result white residents should be treated as enemies and "rooted out".
