This ten-year \$10 million contract should be re-examined. This contract comes just a few months after residents of Villa Park and Northwest Pasadena were begging City Manager Steve Mermel over Zoom to help them gain access to the \$2 trillion in clean energy infrastructure spending for jobs that the Biden administration was proposing and he responded that "those were union jobs and if you were not in the union, the City cannot do anything to help."

Why in the world can the city not train residents to help with the Rose Bowl game activities and Rose Parade? Most of the law enforcement services deal with traffic.
