Our Academy urges the Council to approve the proposed Zoning Code Amendment permitting up to three dispensaries per district and reducing the distance requirement between cannabis dispensaries from 1000 to 450 feet (while leaving distance buffers to all sensitive uses, such as schools, parks, etc., the same). Doing so promotes the functioning cannabis program that Pasadena residents desired and approved, and the jobs, tax revenues and community benefits that were long promised but, to date, are under-delivered.

The current location restrictions allow at most four dispensaries. "Up to four" is not "Up to six." The voters wisely gave the city council the power to amend the ordinance to achieve the desired goal; it is time now to do so.




Rethinking Alcohol and Other Drugs (RAD) is a coalition of community-based agencies, stakeholders and residents working together to improve the health and safety of communities across the San Gabriel Valley by reducing alcohol, cannabis, and other drug related harms through education, youth empowerment, and policy development.



RAD respectfully opposes any action taken to reduce the distance between cannabis retailers in the City of Pasadena from 1,000 feet to 450 feet. RAD also opposes increasing the maximum number of cannabis retailers allowed in each city district from one to three. Amending the current cannabis retail regulations would drastically increase the access and availability of cannabis in our community which has been linked with an increase in cannabis consumption.



Additionally, reducing the distance between retail sites and increasing the number of sites will has to the potential to result in an overconcentration of cannabis retail sites which will not only expand access but also increase the exposure and visibility of cannabis in our community. Youth are especially vulnerable to this type of exposure and influence. By increasing the number of cannabis sites in our community we are essentially permissive attitudes about cannabis.



We respectfully ask that you oppose any action to amend the municipal code to increase the potential number of cannabis retail sides and decrease the distance between those sites in order to protect the public health and safety of our community.
