Dear Mayor Gordo and Members of the City Council,

Re: AMENDING CHAPTER 17.50 OF TITLE 17 (ZONING CODE) OF THE PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE TO INCREASE POTENTIAL CANNABIS **RETAIL SITES, AND TO CORRECT DISTANCE SEPARATION BETWEEN** CANNABIS LABS AND OTHER CANNABIS USES

Day One is incredibly concerned about the proposed amendments to the city's municipal code allowing for additional licensed cannabis retailers.

The proposed changes have the potential to severely impact the health and safety of youth across the community. By increasing the number of cannabis retailers, we are effectively increasing the accessibility of cannabis by youth. Although we know that it is illegal for youth to purchase cannabis, increasing the number of retailers in the community increases the amount of cannabis circulating within the community. According to the California Health Kids Survey (2018-19), only 9% of PUSD 9th graders reported that cannabis was difficult to obtain in Pasadena. This is incredibly concerning given the risks associated with cannabis use for anyone under the age of 21.

Cannabis use during adolescence is directly associated with:

- Lower academic performance
- Increased risk for mental health issues
- Impaired brain development
- Increased risky behavior

As an agency committed to supporting the development of youth and increasing opportunities for youth throughout Pasadena, we ask that you oppose any amendments to CHAPTER 17.50 OF TITLE 17 of the city's municipal code. We urge you to think about the potential impacts associated with increasing the number of cannabis retailers in our community and support the health and safety of youth across Pasadena.

Dear Mayor Gordo and City Council,

I respectfully oppose any action taken to reduce the distance between cannabis retailers in the City of Pasadena from 1,000 feet to 450 feet. I also opposes increasing the maximum number of cannabis retailers allowed in each city district from one to three. Amending the current cannabis retail regulations would drastically increase the access and availability of cannabis in our community which has been linked with an increase in cannabis consumption.

Additionally, reducing the distance between retail sites and increasing the number of sites will has to the potential to result in an overconcentration of cannabis retail sites which will not only expand access but also increase the exposure and visibility of cannabis in our community. Youth are especially vulnerable to this type of exposure and influence.

Dear Mayor Victor Gordo and members of the City Council.

Rethinking Access to Marijuana (RAM) is a diverse group of community-based organizations working together to educate people across Los Angeles County about the harms associated with marijuana use especially among youth. We are committed to helping LA County residents to advocate in their communities to help minimize youth exposure to marijuana and protect communities. Our mission is to prevent access and availability that leads to use of marijuana products by youth in Los Angeles County and our vision is to see flourishing youth and communities free from marijuana-related harms. RAM opposes the City of Pasadena's efforts to amend CHAPTER 17.50 OF TITLE 17 of the city's municipal code. Increasing the density of cannabis retailers has severe impacts to the surrounding community and especially youth. The overconcentration of cannabis retailers in a community substantially increases the availability of cannabis in the community and increases the risk for misuse and abuse. In a recent study published by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, experts concluded that adding additional cannabis retailers within a community with existing retailers can increase the number of cannabis related hospitalizations by 6.8%. Youth are incredibly vulnerable to the increased availability of cannabis messaging.

RAM respectfully asks that this council consider the dangerous risks associated with increasing the number of cannabis retailers in Pasadena in an effort to protect the public health and safety of all community members. As a leading city in the San Gabriel Valley, we ask that the City of Pasadena take stand against the expansion of the cannabis industry and protect the future of our youth.
