The main building (or sanctuary) is the building requested for historic designation. This building is a significant example of the Mission Revival architectural style, constructed in 1930, designed by Frederick Kennedy Jr., built by J. Fred Votz. Frederick Kennedy, Jr. was a notable architect who designed numerous important Period Revival buildings in Pasadena during the 1920s and 1930s. Also, the 22 rank Artisan Organ was built by members of the congregation using parts from local company Artisan Organ Co. of Pasadena. Pasadena Conservatory of Music also began here at Mt. Olive. ^{Sanctuary met at Mt. Olive for decades.}

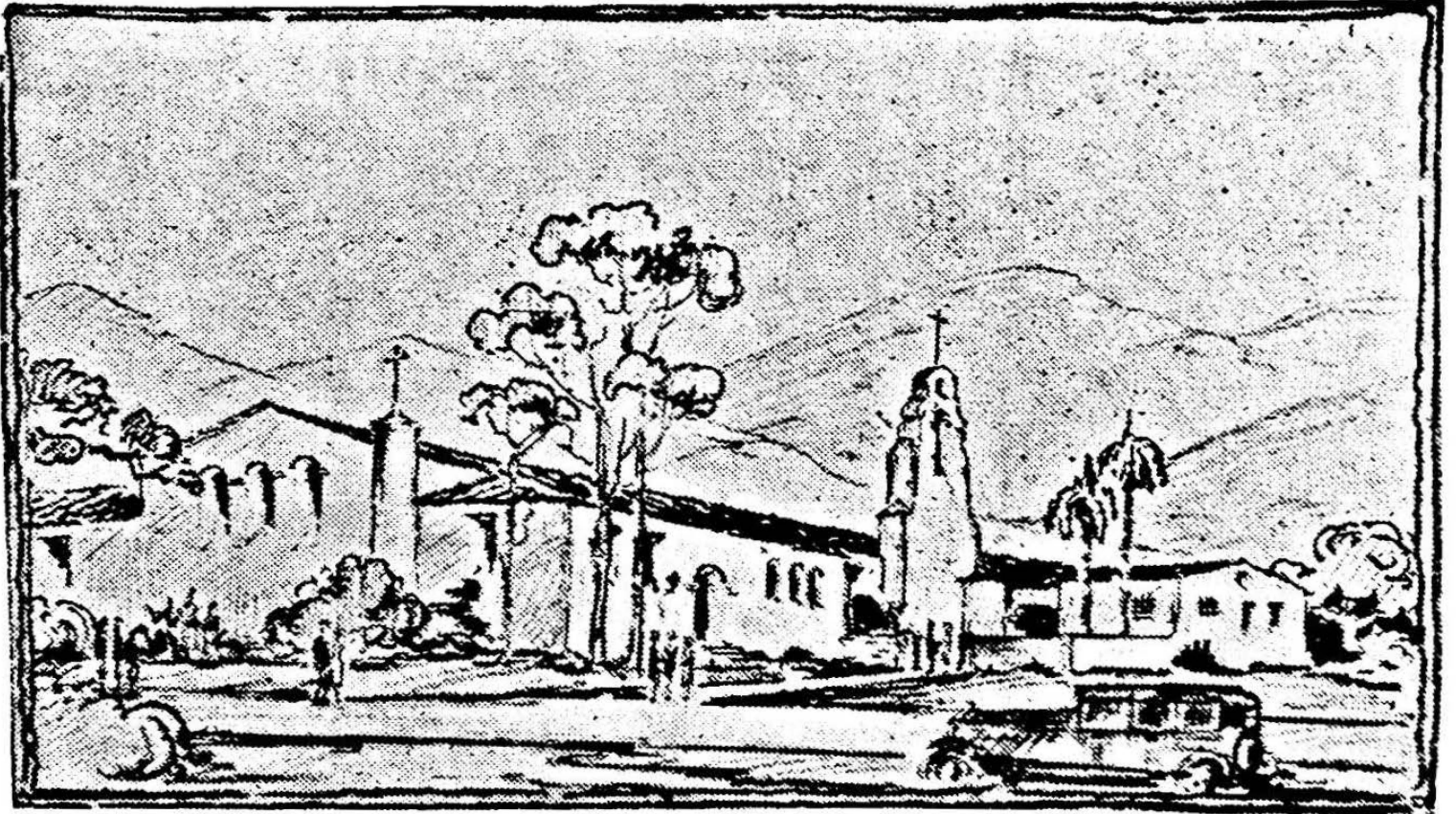

Church Members Build New Organ

THE POSSIBILITY of acquiring a new organ for their church seemed a task of gigantic proportions when the 125-member congregation of Mt. Olive Lutheran Church of Pasadena met to discuss it last spring.

Today that congregation is probably the proudest anywhere. It not only has a fine new organ but each member has the sense of accomplishment which comes from working together and achieving much more than they dared hope.

The new 22-rank Artisan organ was built piece by piece and wire by wire, by members of the congregation themselves. Its special echo effects and stereophonic units were also installed by the members.

★
RAISING the money to purchase the organ kits from Artisan Organ Company of Altadena wasn't easy but the congregation subscribed so enthusiastically that there was enough money left over to buy an 18-note chime to go with it.

Norman Sauppe, lay chairman of the project, volunteered his home and 30 men and women, ages 15 to 76, came in the evenings and on weekends to build the component parts from the kits. Construction began on May 14 on the tone generators and changers, and amplifiers. In three weeks this phase was completed and work moved to the church at 1118 N. Allen Ave.

Sauppe says they all had so

much fun and were so interested in the construction that they were disappointed when the kits were all assembled. He and another electrician from the congregation demonstrated the art of soldering the wires and assembly and nearly everyone tried his hand at it.

The new organ was assembled in the console of the old 5-rank organ, using the original keyboards, couplers, pedals and speakers. The old organ was dismantled on July 1 after the choir had recessed for the summer. Testing and wiring of the console was done in the choir loft and completed on Aug. 17.

★
THE REV. MARTIN ZAGEL, pastor, says that the project was the most satisfying and interesting experience of his 42 years in the ministry. He added that it was so fascinating that he spent a good deal of time watching the assembly and even did some of the wiring.

Sauppe pointed out that an organ of the quality they now have would cost approximately \$7,000 but by assembling it themselves the cost ran only to about \$2,400. The instrument has 230 electronic tubes, 178 tone generators, 22 speaking stops and 22 speakers in four tone cabinets, and a four channel sound system.

A dedication service and recital is being held this afternoon at 3 p.m. Gordon McMillan, well-known organist, will be guest musician. George Player is parish organist and choir master and Erich Zorr is Walther League organist.
