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

# Rezoning Religious Land is a Matter of Racial Justice: Contact Pasadena's City Council Today!



As our nation celebrates July 4th, it is important that we take to heart the words of Jesus: "The truth will set you free" (John 8:31-32). July 4th did not bring freedom to everyone, just to property-owning white males. It took hundreds of years, and intense struggle, for women and people of color to be liberated and have equal rights, and the struggle is ongoing.

During our Housing Justice Forum, Donald King, an African American leader from Seattle, shared with us the struggle of Black people in Seattle. Many migrated from the oppressive South with its Jim Crow laws and lynchings and created a vibrant community in the city center, despite many obstacles imposed by whites. Banks would not lend money to Black churches to purchase land and build their sanctuaries, so they raised funds and paid cash. As whites moved back into the city center, many people of color were priced out and moved to the suburbs and nearby cities. Attendance at Black churches dwindled. Many faced financial challenges.

When Seattle passed an ordinance rezoning religious land for affordable housing, it had a "poison bill" for Black churches. It required that housing be 100% affordable for those earning 60% of the Area Median Income (AMI). This worked for white churches, but not for cash-strapped Black churches. They needed the affordability level to be up to 80% of AMI to make projects work financially for them. The Black churches launched a vigorous campaign and convinced the City Council to adopt the 80% threshold. Thanks to the efforts of Donald King and the Nehemiah Initiative, Black churches are now making plans to use their underutilized land for affordable housing.

We are facing a similar situation here in Pasadena. The first church that has taken steps to have affordable housing built on its property is African American, but it can't do so because of zoning. The Planning Department's proposal will not help this Black church. Our MHCH proposal will enable this Black church to fulfill its mission and have affordable housing built on its excess property.

For hundreds of years, people of color have struggled for the right to own property and have the freedom to use it as whites do. Pasadena has an opportunity to help right some of the wrongs it has done to the African American community by rezoning religious land for affordable housing. This is something that the African American community clearly wants. Last year over 60 community and religious leaders, including Council member Kennedy and Anthony Portantino, gathered at the New Hope Baptist Church on N. Fair Oaks to hold a vigil in support of rezoning religious land for affordable housing. See <u>https://makinghousinghappen.net/2021/04/28/our-</u> prayer-vigil-for-affordable-housing-and-racial-justice-was-a-great-success/ You can also watch our Housing Justice Forum on Rezoning Religious Land for Affordable Housing that took place this week, and hear a powerful presentation by Donald King and Nick Welch. The Seattle City website makes it clear that rezoning religious land is a matter of racial justice:

"Displacement of Seattle residents, especially within Black, Indigenous, and communities of color, is an ongoing challenge. In neighborhoods like the Central Area, for example, the Black population has decreased from more than 70 percent in the 1970s to less than one-fifth of the neighborhood's population today. Many faith organizations have advocated for City policies that support affordable housing development on their property as a strategy to address displacement, strengthen community ties, and maintain community ownership in their neighborhood."

"Allowing additional density for long-term, income-restricted affordable housing on religious property helps us address Seattle's affordability crisis and supports the many faith-based organizations eager to use their land to create homes for their low-income neighbors. When paired with the support of public funds and tools like community preference, these land use policies help address historic and ongoing inequities in housing access by supporting community-driven and community-owned development."



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#### Good Afternoon,

Union Station Homeless Services has been actively following the proposal to rezone congregational land. We thank you for your consideration of this proposal which we strongly support. We have seen this council support other innovative changes like the Safe Haven Bridge to Housing as well as the Civic Center, Heritage Square South and Salvation Army projects. Congregational Land Use is the next logical step toward creating sufficient affordable housing. We are hopeful that the council will implement this much needed zone change as the Planning and Community Development Department recommends but with slight amendments at the July 11th council meeting.

In addition to the hard work of this council toward ending homelessness in Pasadena and getting more affordable housing built, we have seen our faith congregations hard at work to do all that they can to address these issues. Ten churches have already expressed interest in building affordable housing on their land which would bring in hundreds of much needed units of affordable housing at no cost to the city.

We at Union Station Homeless Services have seen the impact that the lack of affordable housing in the County and across the San Gabriel Valley has had in further creating homelessness and displacement. We've also seen the difference that a sufficient stock of affordable housing units can make in creating health, equity and reducing homelessness in communities.

Pasadena must continue to adjust policies that will ensure more access to housing that people can afford. Therefore, we urge you to adopt a zoning policy that will allow congregations to have affordable housing built on their underutilized land. In order to ensure that these changes are effective and sufficient, please pass an ordinance that works for these congregations by increasing the number of units per acre from 32 to 36, only four additional units.

Thank you for your time and for your consideration of this critical amendment.

Dear Planning Commissioners, Mayor Gordo, and City Council,

We appreciate our city's commitment to affordable housing. As you know, one of the biggest obstacles to building affordable housing is a lack of sites. About ten churches in Pasadena would like to have affordable housing built on their underutilized land. Yet most of these churches are not properly zoned for this use. For this reason, I ask that the city create a citywide religious land zoning amendment that will permit housing and make it possible for projects to qualify for funding sources like tax credits, and that will streamline the approval process. This will assure that these projects will succeed with funding and provide well-designed, beautiful housing in a timely fashion.

The housing crisis is real, and the need is urgent, as evident from these statistics:

- 527 in our last homeless count (2019)
- 700 students considered homeless in PUSD
- 19% of all PCC students have experienced homelessness.
