2022 HOMELESS COUNT RESULTS


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On February 22, 2022, 512 people were experiencing homelessness in Pasadena.


















BLACK PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS



cited eviction or foreclosure as a factor in their housing loss; 80% occurred in Pasadena




TRANSITIONAL AGE YOUTH (18-24)



STRUCTURAL & SYSTEMIC CAUSES OF HOMELESSNESS

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While Pasadena has invested heavily in the homelessness response system, it continues to bear the challenges and failures of other existing systems.


