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Dear Pasadena City Council Members,

I am writing on behalf of Sequoyah School. The school's leadership has followed the successful relinquishment of State Route (SR) 710 Northern Stub to the City of Pasadena and appreciates the recent opportunities to be involved in re-envisioning improvements to the streetscape in the SR 710-corridor surrounding the school. We also look forward to becoming involved in the process determining the eventual transformation of the whole neighborhood including the "Ditch".

School representatives observed the August 24<sup>th</sup> Transportation Commission (TAC) meeting during which commissions members reviewed the Pasadena Department of Transportation staff recommendation and report summarizing the Measure R Mobility Improvement Projects (MIP) List. We were pleased to hear TAC's thoughtful discussion and concluding vote in support for the MIP List. We urge City Council Members to affirm the TAC recommendation.

Sequoyah School's elementary program campus is located at 535 S. Pasadena Avenue and the school has recently purchased property at 500 S. Pasadena Avenue to accommodate administrative offices. The school believes that the MIP List, in particular the Pasadena Avenue and St. John Roadway Network, address many of the concerns that members of the school community have expressed over time and specifically during the public outreach phase of concept development.

Our concerns include: the high speed and volume of traffic along Pasadena Ave. as cars accelerate towards freeway onramps, the safety of pedestrians and bikers along California Blvd. and Pasadena Ave., the distance for pedestrians to cross at the Pasadena Ave./California Blvd. intersection, the poor conditions of narrow sidewalks and lack of sidewalks, the entrance approach and exit from the school parking lot onto Pasadena Ave., the need for a safe pedestrian crossing across Pasadena Ave. to Palmetto St., and the high speed of traffic along St. John Avenue near Singer Park.

We are pleased to see that the Pasadena Avenue and St. John Roadway Network is listed as a high priority, and we urge you to support implementation of the MIP List. These are improvements that could save many lives.

Thank you for all your efforts in this regard.
