## A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PASADENA, CALIFORNIA, SETTING PRIORITIES FOR THE FILING OF WRITTEN ARGUMENTS RELATED TO CHARTER AMENDMENT MEASURES, AND DIRECTING THE CITY ATTORNEY TO PREPARE AN IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF EACH MEASURE

WHEREAS, a Primary Municipal Election is to be held in the City of Pasadena, to

be consolidated with the Statewide Primary Election to be held on Tuesday, March 5,

2024, at which there will be submitted to the voters of said City three local ballot

measures in substantially the following form:

**SECTION 2.** The City Council hereby directs the City Clerk to transmit a copy of each measure to the City Attorney. The City Attorney shall cause to be prepared an impartial analysis of each measure showing the effect of each measure on the existing law and the operation of the City. The impartial analyses shall be filed by the date set by the City Clerk for the filing of primary arguments, December 14, 2023.
