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

What do you see as the objectives and goals of the advisory body to which you seek appointment?

The objectives of this working group are exceedingly complex and very daunting.

Current cultural and social norms as well as environmental awareness are shining a bright light on 70-plus years of decisions made concerning the 710 Stub. These decisions made across decades have created a bottomless reservoir of anger in residents across disparate neighborhoods.

The more marginalized communities in Pasadena are like communities across the country that have been deeply impacted by many state and interstate highways planned, then constructed during the past 100 years. These different groups carry deep scars from their neighborhoods being cavalierly destroyed. Neighborhood churches, businesses and community organizations were forced to close and their importance to community cohesion was minimized, if not completely ignored.

Children and grandchildren of these forced out residents express anger over the financial impact and loss of security that the sale of these properties brought upon following generations. Possibilities lost, or at least greatly reduced.

Many of the more affluent residents, many in District 6, express anger about the relentless traffic that got rerouted onto once quiet streets. Streets that were not designed to carry heavy truck loads are now stressed and cracked. Not enough proper sidewalks. Streets, such as St. John and Pasadena, becoming massively overloaded. Decades of increased noise and diesel pollution; the wear and tear on neighborhoods, properties, and nerves.

Many small and medium sized businesses were permanently impacted or destroyed by this rerouting. Some of those might be found when the research is done on past property owners.

This commission's objectives and goals? Wow. To find a forward-thinking and morally sound path through this fraught history by recognizing all these stakeholders as well as current business and residential interests that want involvement. Past and current marginalized communities must be recognized and be given institutional help to start new businesses and to build safer and stronger futures for their children.

The goal must also be to design a strip of land that will be of interest and value to both residents and international travelers. This is a brilliant chance to incorporate Pasadena's city council recent resolution to go 100% carbon-free by the end of 2030. Ground up innovation. Pasadena can, and hopefully will become, an exemplary model for other cities trying to unravel and address their past errors while creating vibrant community and financial improvements for all their stakeholders.

How would you help achieve these objectives and goals? What special qualities would you bring?

In a perfect world I would have a degree in city planning or architecture. Short of that perfect world, I have many relevant experiences.

I designed for Euro Disneyland and Universal Studios in Orlando. For the latter I was part of the small design team of art directors that essentially laid out the ground plan for the areas/lands and rides. You might ask, why not architects instead art directors? We tend to be better at whimsy and caprice. Sometimes we do a pretty good job of thinking outside the box. Of course, the second step is to bring in architects and engineers. Those theme park projects were bookended by design in film in LA: Jurassic Park, Gremlins II, Amazing Stories and many more movies spanning 18 years.

Prior to my design career I had experience with the rewards and difficulties experienced by small businesses. I managed the original Peet's Coffee in Berkeley. Besides being a very cool cultural icon, it gave me a window into workers' rights, tight budgets, quality control and possibly most important, how these businesses build up a neighborhood and attract other destination businesses. Nothing more fun than a good coffee shop, some great restaurants and a Pottery Barn.

Achieving these objectives and goals... I would truly listen and hear the concerns of the multitudes of stakeholders. I would reach out to experts in various disciplines and ask for information and do my best working within the committee to find consensus. To weave everyone's wish list (I'm sorry, you can't have the pony...) with what is financially and environmentally feasible. I would be present and be a team player.

1. What do you see as the objectives and goals of the advisory body to which you seek appointment?

The overarching goal for the Former 710 Stub Working Group is to make sound recommendations to the Planning Commission and City Council for a Concept Plan/Vision and key policies for a Specific Plan to guide redevelopment of the former 710 stub area, a unique, unprecedented planning opportunity for Pasadena. This will include input into the consultant selection process. Recommendations from the Group on the Concept Plan/Vision should be based on solid preparation through research and discussion that relies on actively listening to community and stakeholder input, and collaborating creatively as a team with City staff and consultants. The end product should ultimately result in a Specific Plan that guides reuse of the land vacated from relinquishment of the SR 710 Stub to stitch together and reconnect Pasadena in a way that is sustainable, equitable, economical, contextual, and of high architectural quality—a Plan that helps repair past injustices while building community and a new and better sense of place.

This Specific Plan and its implementation may be achieved by articulating draft project goals and objectives at the outset, then developing a Vision and Guiding Design and Planning Principles, based generally on the following activities:

- Understand the local context, past, present and future potential. Review the history of the
 project, including issues of displacement, its surrounding characteristics with respect to land
 use/zoning and historic preservation, housing, environment, parks and open space,
 transportation, etc., and its surrounding demographics related to education, employment, etc.
 Consider the context in relation to potential City needs that might be fulfilled through sound
 planning.
- Based on research and stakeholder input, help generate alternatives with respect to potential land uses/zoning, urban form, mobility network (walkability, biking, vehicle use, mass transit connections to the 134/210 interchange and 'L" line stations and bus routes), infrastructure, range of housing types, places for workforce/small business and entrepreneurial development, educational and parks and open space opportunities, etc. With respect to fundamental urban form leading to a Vision, the team will need to address some difficult, basic questions, such as:
 - Should the "ditch" created by the 710 stub be filled in, partially filled in, or not?
 - Should we take advantage of the excavation and promote terracing, which would allow for more developable surface area?

- Should we take advantage of the excavation by filling in the site, and use the underground space solely for those that do not need natural light (i.e., parking, shopping/large retail, theaters, etc.), leaving housing and open space on the surface?
- Should the area knit in seamlessly with adjacent development, i.e. be an extension of Old Pasadena on the east or housing on the west? Should it be 'invisible' or have a new sense of place? Should it continue the Arroyo Seco and become an extended nature corridor? Should it continue Arlington Gardens northward and be conceived as a 'green/community garden-like' setting? Should it have its own physical character be 'of its time' yet reflect its history? Or, have some combination of the above?
- Should the project be undertaken by one developer (public, private?) who will install the entire infrastructure first before any other infill projects are considered? If not, how will incremental growth be managed so that the area is actually connected to the rest of the City?
- What kinds of financing, partnerships need to be established for development?
 Sales, ground leases, air rights, underground rights? What are the possibilities?

The team might look at other successful redevelopment projects worldwide and perhaps encourage an international design competition to generate ideas and further involve the community. Ways to honor and compensate the community and those who were displaced should also be considered.

- Then, develop a set or checklist of Guiding Design/Planning Principles to evaluate alternatives and draft a Vision and Key Policies.
- Based on careful consideration, feasibility analysis, and deliberation of alternatives, decide on
 recommendations to present to the Planning Commission, then the City Council for further
 deliberation, adoption, and incorporation into a new Specific Plan and environmental
 document. The Group might have further input as these are developed and refined.

2. How would you help achieve these objectives and goals? What special qualities would you bring?

Reusing the 710 stub area is a rare, unprecedented planning opportunity that I would approach wholeheartedly with enthusiasm. I am uniquely prepared to tackle the project. Not only am I very familiar with the background, history, and parameters related to the 710 stub, which has been of personal interest to me for years, my planning students at Cal Poly Pomona have taught me to have an

open mind about uncovering new information about its reuse and taking a creative approach to potential solutions.

In Spring 2021, as a Professor of Urban and Regional Planning at Cal Poly Pomona, I taught a 15-week urban design studio course, called "Re-Imagine the 710: Connecting Pasadena through Physical Design and Sustainable Practices." With two dozen planning students working in teams, we first developed a Background Report that covered topics related to the context, generated a set of Design Guidelines, then prepared six, different potential land use schemes for presentation and criticism. To do so, we heard from dozens of community leaders and stakeholders. For example, Brian Biery, Steven Sneed, and others taught us about the history of displacement and discrimination in razing the land for the 710 stub. David Grannis, Joanne Nichols, and others taught us about the struggle to stop construction and related transportation issues to be resolved. David Reyes talked about the city's planning process; Dr. Jill Shook addressed the need for more affordable housing; Sue Mossman, about protecting historic resources; Meredith McKenzie about its relationship to the Arroyo and natural resources, and so on. Stefanos Polyzoides walked us through the 2017 "Connecting Pasadena Project" that resulted in a preliminary scheme for the area. He encouraged my students to 'go beyond' Moule & Polyzoides's three-day effort, and to think broadly and creatively about how the new-found land could be redeveloped. The six resulting student-lead schemes built upon what they had learned - as well as the "Connecting Pasadena Project" proposal--and showed a range of possibilities. I would be happy to share materials I have and what I have learned.

My vast professional background and experience also make me uniquely qualified to contribute to the Working Group and its planning effort. I hold a Ph.D. in Architecture, specializing in urban design, and certificates in Inclusionary Teaching methods. In 2014, I was elected to Lambda Alpha International, The International Honorary Society for Land Economics, and in 2022, a Fellow of the American Institute of Certified Planners (FAICP), the highest professional echelon of the American Planning Association. A long-time educator, I have taught university planning-related courses for over four decades, specializing in land use, affordable housing, sustainability, and social and environmental justice. For example, in my land use course required for all undergrads in the program, for five years students collaborated with Heritage Housing Partners on the "Operation Main Street Project." This was an effort to redevelop land in town centers along the 210 corridor through multiple benefits: adaptive reuse that preserved historic properties, and measures to increase affordable housing, livability, walkability, and economic vitality. As a professional planner, I have worked on specific plans and general plan updates.

At Cal Poly, I also founded and direct the California Center for Land and Water Stewardship--which stemmed from the APA award-winning "Golden Necklace Project" to connect open space along the riverways while protecting the watershed. The research and community-based project hub was established to increase parks and recreational opportunities for communities in need, while protecting natural resources. This stemmed from my earlier role in establishing an environmental issues section at the UN as part of the international Habitat-Human Settlements Conference, my position as a staff researcher with the US Dept. of Energy while in graduate school, and my involvement as a professional

planner and City representative on the Bear Valley Coordinated Resources Management Plan for the San Bernardino Mountains working alongside the US Forest Service.

My education and experience is also in municipal and institutional administration, with experience in real estate financing and development. I hold a PhD minor (MBA equivalent) from the Anderson School at UCLA in arts/non-profit financial management. As a city department head, in addition to managing all planning, code compliance, economic and community development activities, I oversaw a redevelopment agency, managing its revolving loan fund, its CDBG and other tax-generated monies, and building public works projects as well as affordable, City-owned senior housing projects. As the Associate Dean of Cal Poly's College of Environmental Design, I served as the Chief Operating Officer, responsible for administrative oversight of curricula, budgeting, fundraising, facilities, and personnel, which included departments, programs, centers and loans on real properties.

My community service and advocacy for Pasadena is also extensive. I have served on the City's Planning, Design (twice), Transportation Advisory (TAC), and Historic Preservation commissions, as well as the Mayor's Green Leadership Summit, 2015 General Plan Update, and Mayor's Housing Element Update advisory commissions. For over twenty years, I have contributed as a community advocate, I served as Director of Advocacy for the American Institute of Architect's Pasadena & Foothills Chapter, a founder of National AIA's Citizen Architect, a pro bono housing design/build service organization, and three times as President of the Bungalow Heaven Neighborhood Association. My direct involvement resulted in Bungalow Heaven's listing on the State and National Registers, as well as designation as a "Great Neighborhood" in the APA's Great Places in America Program. My recent personal efforts to reconvert market-rate units near my neighborhood back to the housing project's original entitlement as affordable to seniors, at 1070 N. Lake Avenue, resulted in the creation of over 100 new affordable units for Pasadena. I am currently building an ADU and understand the City's permitting process intimately. Finally, as President of the Southern California Planning Congress since 2011 and on its Board of Directors since 2003, I have produce scores of educational public programs and workshops aimed at interjurisdictional problem-solving in the SoCal region. These have included topics related to housing and homelessness, historic preservation, social justice, transportation, parks and open space, resource conservation, and climate change.

Thus, I will bring to the 710 team not just my professional background, but my experience on all sides of the planning counter.


What do you see as the objectives and goals of the advisory body to which you seek appointment?

My appointment to this advisory body would add value and help achieve the aforementioned goals/objectives in a number of ways. Firstly, I have an ability to cast vision and conceive solutions to problems as evidenced by my founding of Greenline Housing Foundation to address restorative justice in a tangible way. Additionally, I currently serve as a member and spokesperson for the newly-formed task force, 710 Restorative Justice Pasadena and can therefore participate in conversations around what restorative justice might practically look like as a part of this initiative. 

Reclaiming the land formerly taken for the 710 freeway and returning it for use by Pasadena is an historic opportunity, that will impact Pasadena and its identity for decades.

- 1. The Bennett Plan for Pasadena was readopted by the city in 1988. It is widely praised for the City Hall and north-south axis on Garfield connecting the Library and the Civic Auditorium. Not widely discussed, the plan also included an east-west axis from City Hall to Orange Grove. The east-west axis was supposed to be anchored on the west end by another civic building, the Carmelita (situated between Holly and Colorado, at Orange Gove, adjacent to the former 710 property). This group should learn more about Bennett's plan and objectives for connecting the City Hall anchored east-west axis with this western part of Pasadena and consider how it may inform our effort today planning for development of the land from the 710.
- 2. Pasadena is under pressure to provide increased housing at a rate several times our historic average. We must approach how this will impact development of the 710 land thoughtfully and strategically. A collaborative public effort (e.g. the CPP process) will not only bring forward new, innovative ideas, but will educate the interested public in the challenges we face.
- 3. This planning opportunity should include connection with a prominent asset of Pasadena, the Arroyo Seco. Improving access by planning for public transportation to this area, pedestrian and bike friendly options, along with parking and safe portals will attract residents and visitors. Connecting this project to the natural beauty of the Arroyo will increase the quality of life for residents and visitors.
- 4. There also must be convenient connection with Old Town Pasadena. Connecting this project with the amenities of this well-planned commercial area will increase the quality of life for residents and visitors. Additional planning for public transportation, pedestrian and bike friendly options, and other low impact forms of access will increase the quality of life for residents and visitors.
- 5. This now available land presents us with the opportunity to improve the connection between Pasadena center with the northern parts of the city. The fact that this project is oriented north/south invites consideration of access and portals to encourage interconnection between the city's northern portions and Pasadena center. Improving access by planning for public transportation to this area, pedestrian and bike friendly options, along with parking and safe portals will attract residents and visitors.


