





Inclusive Process



Reconnecting Communities

- Each Councilmember will appoint 1 member;
- The Mayor will appoint 2 members;
- The City Council as a body will appoint 4 atlarge members (total of 13);
- Two of the 13 members shall be descendants of community members that were displaced due to freeway expansion; and

The composition of the working group should be diverse and reflective of the entire City and may be appointed in consideration of a background in Planning, Economic Development/Real Estate/Housing Development, Transportation, Historic Preservation, Engineering, Community Advocacy, or other related area of expertise.
