### Office of the City Manager

- The Early Childhood Development & Early Learning Task Force convened from April 2022 – September 2022.
- The Task Force reported back to City Council in November 2022 on:
  - > The current status of implementation of the 2015 Policy,
  - > The 2015 Policy's alignment with the most recent science regarding best practices on implementing early childhood programs, and
  - > Any revisions to the 2015 Policy needed to support the City's youngest children and families in light of COVID, racial injustice, cycles of violence, and economic instability.

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### Local Context- Demographics


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#### Demographic Profile: Children aged 0-5 years old

There are 10,265 children with ages 0-5 years old in Pasadena.



That is about 7.2% of the more than 140,000 residents of Pasadena.




There are 11% more children younger than 6 years than there was 10 years ago.



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### 2022 Early Child Development Policy

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In November 2022, the Task Force presented its findings to City Council:

- Revised Vision Statement
- Maintains a Systems Approach
- Consolidated Eight Building Blocks into Three Core Elements
  - Aligned in Vision, Linked in Action (to build & sustain partnerships)
  - Data Collection & Measures of Success
  - Strengthening Families (including the critical transition from pre-school to kindergarten in a young child's development)
- Clarified City's role as convener of the larger community in building & sustaining partnerships

## Areas of Recommendation

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The Task Force provided specific and action-oriented recommendations to achieve better outcomes for children and families. Areas of recommendation include:

- Financing strategies for programming & support
- Strengthening data collection related to young families
- Enhancements to structure and support for the Office of the Young Child & implementation of the Policy.





# Opportunities for Collaboration- City & PUSD

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Create a meaningful partnership and immediate alignment of diverse stakeholders to achieve visible results:

- Early Development Instrument (EDI) Assessment- Winter 2024
  - > Prior data collection years 2013, 2017, 2020
- Universal Pre-K
  - > Convene a working group to assist with design & support of early childhood programs
- Assist in developing a district-wide campaign to introduce families to the school district.
  - > Getting Ready for Kinder Campaign, inclusion in City marketing channels
