
We monitor and control for mosquito-borne disease in the community while supporting residents to keep their properties bite-free.

By the numbers:

- We serve 26 cities and unincorporated L.A. County communities in San Gabriel Valley
- 1.5 million residents
- We have 37 full-time employees
- \$16.90 per year, per parcel









- The District was formed in 1989 to protect residents from vector-borne diseases.
- SGV Mosquito is one of five mosquito control districts that serve Los Angeles County.
- The California Health and Safety Code §2000-2067 grants authority to vector control districts.



MOSQUITOES IN YOUR CITY

CULEX MOSQUITOES

- Native
- Active at Dusk & Dawn
- Transmit West Nile virus ("Bird Disease")

West Nile Virus

- Flu-like symptoms for 1 in 5 people infected
- Central nervous system affected for 1 in 150 people infected




AEDES MOSQUITOES

- Invasive
- Day-time biter
- Transmits Zika, dengue, canine heartworm
- Develops resistance to adult pesticides
- Imported travel cases
- Potential for outbreak









West Nile virus Transmission Cycle

West Nile virus (WNV)is most commonly spread to people by the bite of an infected mosquito.



WEST NILE VIRUS

- Detected in L.A. County in 2004
- Flu-like symptoms for 1 in 5 people infected
- Central nervous system affected for 1 in 150 people infected
 - Encephalitis (inflammation of the brain)
 - Meningitis (inflammation of membranes that surround brain and spinal cord)
- No cure or human vaccine




West Nile virus+ Detection Process

- Alert City Trustee and Staff
- 2. Inspect known sources and search for new ones
- 3. Monitor surveillance
- 4. Notify residents through multiple methods
- 5. Activate ENS during elevated risk






DRING HILL




- Monitor over 700 induvial mosquito breeding sites
 - 142 non-functional swimming pools
 - Over 400 gutters, drains, and sump pumps



- Monitor over 900 underground storm drain lids
- Over 6 miles of open flood channels
- Devils Gate Reservoir
- Arroyo Seco




- 2023: Responded to 147 Service Requests
 - 70 Property Consultations




- 2023: 57 unique Education and Outreach activities
- Over 1,000 educational door hangers delivered to properties with elevated invasive Aedes activity

TIP, TOSS, AND PROTECT



- Tip stagnant water from containers weekly
- Toss unused containers
- Protect with insect repellent
 - DEET
 - Oil of Lemon Eucalyptus (or PMD)
 - Picaridin
 - IR3535
