There are a number of issues that have already been publicly asked to be considered including: campaign finance limits, term limits and vacancies, the manner in which Mayor vs. Councilmembers are eligible to run for citywide office, terminology changes, procurement limits, and reform to the Taxpayers Protection Act. It is my hope that this list is not exhaustive and that other topics may be added during the first few meetings of the Task Force.

The scope and charge of the task force is important because it will address issues that have come up in the past decade by Councilmembers AND the public to help the future City of Pasadena operate in a more transparent and equitable manner, operationally and functionally.

I agree with the Council that we should look at term limits, increasing the pay to encourage more people to serve. I also think election reform in order to save money such as IRV might be useful. Campaign reform is also an issue of great interest to the community of Pasadena.

I believe the Charter Study Task Force should take an unbiased look at structure and functions of the current charter, hold hearings and do research to determine the best course of action to be taken when rewriting the Charter.
