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Item 3 on Pasadena City Council Monday's agenda requests authorization for the Police Department to purchase 5 fossil fuel powered municipal vehicles, three Ford F-150 trucks and two Ford Explorer Sport Utility Vehicles for \$317,108.

How is it possible that despite the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory adopted by City Council, November 18, 2013, the Pasadena Police Department is still requesting approval for purchase of gasoline and diesel powered vehicles? In 2023, our neighboring small town of South Pasadena purchased 10 electrical vehicles for their Police Department as have Irvine and other California cities. There is apparently a failure of leadership within city departments to enforce environmental goals and policies adopted by City Council.

At the Environmental Advisory Commission (EAC) meeting on April 9, 2024, Ursula Schmidt from PWP discussed an updated Climate Action Plan (CAP) which will be presented to EAC in May. All of these high-sounding reports and strategies are meaningless if city departments do not take them seriously and act in accordance with environmental mandates.

VOTE <u>NO</u> – Item 3 and require Pasadena Police Department to come back with a **revised proposal to purchase electric vehicles**, in accordance with stated City goals.
