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Hi,

I am writing with a public comment for the special city council meeting on February 5,2024

My name is Darren Cooper and I am a resident of Pasadena City Council District 5. I am also a parent of two children at Longfellow Elementary School (with a third set to start in the 2025-2026 school year). I am writing to ask that you help PUSD, Longfellow, and the City of Pasadena work together to accommodate Longfellow Elementary's relocation to Jefferson Elementary for the 2025-2026 school year while Longfellow is undergoing much needed renovations.

As residents on the southeast side of District 5, we were thrilled to see the Jefferson Branch Library open so close to home. The kids love the library, and we frequented it over the summer. We also attended the Fire Service Days and Jefferson, which were also a big hit with the kids. We would be sad to see these services affected and potentially moved away, and I am not taking the ask to move Longfellow to Jefferson lightly. The Longfellow community would not be advocating for the decision to move to Jefferson if we did not believe it was a drastically better alternative for our students and families compared to what was originally proposed by PUSD to relocate to Allendale Elementary.

The Longfellow community is excited and grateful for the funding and opportunity to renovate and modernize our school thanks to Measure O. However, the relocation to Allendale Elementary during renovations would have more than tripled the commute time for most of the Longfellow students and families. For many at the school, it would have meant the difference between being able to walk to school vs. having to commute all the way across Pasadena during rush hour. This would have had real impacts on children's sleep schedules, caregivers' work schedules, and caregivers' ability to get to the school for teacher conferences, volunteering, sick children, etc. On top of that, a significant portion of the Longfellow families were already displaced once not too long ago with the closing of Jefferson Elementary, and this would be a major disruption to them once again. More than 80% of Longfellow students are from socioeconomically disadvantaged households; the move to Allendale would create additional burdens for many of the people in our community who can afford it the least.

My understanding is that the decision to use Jefferson as a relocation site has a positive impact beyond Longfellow Elementary as well, and this will not be a short-lived benefit to PUSD students. The district was also planning to use Allendale as the relocation site for other elementary schools even further north and east of Longfellow, which would have had an even larger impact on those schools. Jefferson provides a centrally located relocation site for those schools as well going forward.

I recognize that asking the city to vacate Jefferson at this point also creates a burden on the city and valuable city services. If there was another alternative, the Longfellow community would not be asking for this. However, with no other options available besides Allendale, this is the only option that we feel meets the needs of our students and community. PUSD's top priority should be educating and caring for our students, and we are asking them to make a tough decision in order to do that. We hope that we have provided enough advanced warning that the city and PUSD can come to an agreement that minimizes the burden on the city, and I ask that you support us in making that happen.

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Hello,

I've been part of the Pasadena community since 1999, and a Longfellow Elementary parent for 8 years. I attended the PUSD school board meeting on Thursday 2-1-24, where several other Longfellow parents expressed their concerns with relocation plans for Longfellow for the 25-26 school year.

PUSD is facing declining enrollment. A committee has been formed to strategize how to keep current students and recruit new families. As we know, higher enrollment means more money for PUSD.

Longfellow families are facing a disruptive relocation for the 25-26 school year, and PUSD stands to lose enrollment due to this change.

We MUST make the change as painless as possible for our families. My son has been attending Blair for the last two years, so I know first hand the huge impact of adding this commute to the daily routine. It has been hard for our family, even thought we have all the advantages of 2 parents, flexible jobs, and a reliable car. Many families will struggle with this commute, leading to more absences and tardies, and even worse traffic congestion in Pasadena and around the Blair & Allendale campuses.

I fully support using Jefferson Elementary as a relocation school for Longfellow. This will unfortunately disrupt the Firefighters and Library services that are currently located there. However, working adults will be better able to adapt to a new location and commute, and I'm sure they will be willing to make this sacrifice to help the hundreds of families enrolled at Longfellow, 85% of whom are socio-economically disadvantaged.

Jefferson also has the advantage of being centrally located, so that when other school get remodeled, they will also have a shorter commute.
