

The Homelessness Plan is built around five action areas, with goals and strategies for each area.






2028 Homelessness Plan Goals













*Hispanic / Latino Share of 2024 Homeless Count
















Fine-Tuning Homelessness Plan Targets

Department of Housing

With two years of data, we plan to revise our yearly prevention and housing targets to ensure we stay on track to achieve a 50% reduction in homelessness.

Insight 1

Despite housing nearly twice as many people as anticipated, our decrease was only 9% instead of the projected 13%, indicating the **need** for more ambitious housing goals.

Insight 2

Moreover, higher-than-anticipated inflows underscore the urgency to ramp up prevention efforts.

In year one...

Nearly double the anticipated number of people were permanently housed

We achieved a 9% reduction in the number of people experiencing homelessness annually.

These results show that concerted efforts can move the needle in meaningful ways.





Looking Forward: 2024 Projects

Department of Housing

Heritage Square South,

a new permanent supportive housing building for seniors 55+, opened in April 2024 and will be fully leased by mid-summer.

A new Safe Parking program

will open on All Saints Church's parking lot on the corner of Walnut St. and Euclid Ave. in fall 2024.

The Bad Weather Shelter

will expand its capacity to be able to serve more people during inclement weather this winter.

Phase I of the Transitional Aged Youth (TAY) housing project

will provide interim housing for six youth, with a preference for PCC students, beginning this summer.
