Dear Members of the Pasadena City Council,

On behalf of the San Rafael Library Associates, a community group dedicated to supporting the San Rafael Library, we are writing to express our strong support for the Central Library Earthquake Retrofit and Building Repairs Project. As dedicated advocates for our local library and the Central Library, we deeply appreciate the essential role the Central Library plays in our community.

Since its unexpected closure in May 2021, the Central Library has faced significant challenges in maintaining its wide array of programs and services. Prior to this, the library was a dynamic center for large-scale events such as the STEAM Fair, ArtNight, and the Author Fair. Unfortunately, these events have either been canceled or significantly scaled down due to space limitations. For instance, ArtNight attendance dropped from over 2,500 participants in 2019 to just 191 at the Lamanda Park Branch in 2023. Similarly, the One City, One Story program saw a dramatic decrease in attendance from 2,500 to 250, now hosted in costly rented spaces.

The closure also affected the Donald R. Wright Auditorium, which once hosted a variety of programs including parenting classes, summer reading events, lectures, film series, and cultural performances. Many of these activities have been canceled or drastically reduced due to the lack of a suitable venue.

Furthermore, the Central Library offered exhibit spaces to community groups at no cost, enriching cultural engagement. These exhibits, once displayed in prominent areas such as the North Entry and Centennial Room, are no longer available, reducing community interaction. Important programs like National Financial Literacy Month, Citizenship Preparation Classes, and the LA Law Librarian & Law Library partnership have also suffered. With these services moved or canceled, patrons, particularly those needing legal resources near the courthouse, are left with fewer options.

Programs providing business counseling, health screenings, and language classes have faced similar disruptions, leading to cancellations or relocations. Volunteer involvement has diminished as well, with fewer opportunities for teens and summer interns.

The impact on children and teen services is especially significant. In 2019, the library hosted nearly 300 programs for youth, attracting thousands of participants. Post-closure, many of these programs, including storytimes and STEAM activities, have been reduced or canceled. Teen programming has seen a severe drop, with fewer volunteers and events now hosted at the Jefferson Branch, leading to a notable decrease in engagement.

The overall decline in library services is stark, with substantial drops in program offerings, attendance, computer use, library visits, item circulation, and reference inquiries from 2019 to 2023.

The Central Library is more than just a building; it is a vital community center fostering education, culture, and engagement. The closure has significantly hindered these roles, emphasizing the need for its reopening. We urge the

City of Pasadena to prioritize the funding and resources needed for the retrofit and repairs. Restoring the Central Library will revive an essential hub for our community, demonstrating a commitment to a vibrant and engaged city.
