787	Latent TBI Treatment	\$420.00	The Department recommends establishing a new Latent TBI Treatment fee. The treatment is composed of an initial visit with the TB Doctor and 3 follow-ups, each visit lasting approximately 30 minutes. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$4,200
788	Hepatitis B Serology	\$55.00	The Department recommends establishing a new Hepatitis B Serology fee, which includes the cost of the serology and staff time to review results. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$440
789	Hepatitis C Serology	\$72.00	The Department recommends establishing a new Hepatitis C Serology fee, which includes the cost of the serology and staff time to review results. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$576
790	Liver Function Test	\$25.00	The Department recommends establishing a new Liver Function Test fee, which includes the cost of the test and staff time to review results. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$700

891	CVC 22500 (g) - Blocking Traffic Lane	\$60.00	The Department recommends establishing a fine for California Vehicle Code (CVC) section 22500(g), to allow for the citation of parked vehicles that block a traffic lane. The fine amount is consistent with other CVC 22500 subsections regarding vehicles parked illegally and in violation of this section. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$500
892	PMC 10.65.010 (B) - Red Flag Day Parking - Prohibited	\$60.00	The Department recommends establishing a fine for Pasadena Municipal Code section 10.65.010B, to allow for the citation of parked vehicles within the City of Pasadena's Very High, High, or Moderate Fire Hazard Severity Zones on Red Flag Day. The fine amount is consistent with the PMC section regarding vehicles parked in temporary no-parking zones and is intended to be a deterrent to vehicles acting in violation of this section. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$1,000
893	CVC 22500 (a) - Parked Within Intersection - Prohibited	\$60.00	The Department recommends establishing a fee for California Vehicle Code (CVC) section 22500(a), to allow for the citation of parked vehicles within an intersection. The fine amount is consistent with other CVC 22500 subsections regarding vehicles parked illegally and in violation of this section. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$500
894	CVC 21211 - Parked in Class I Bikeway - Prohibited	\$75.00	The Department recommends establishing a fee for California Vehicle Code (CVC) Section 21211, which prohibits the stopping, standing, sitting or blocking of the movement of any bicyclist. This would allow for the citation of parked vehicles in violation of a Class I bikeway, as defined in subsection (a) of the CVC. The fine amount is consistent with other safety-related sections and is intended to be a deterrent to vehicles acting in violation of this section. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$500
895	CVC 22500 (n)(1) - Parked Within 20' of Crosswalk - Prohibited	\$75.00	The Department recommends establishing a fee for California Vehicle Code section 22500 (n)(1), which would allow for the citation of parked vehicles in violation of the minimum distance of 20 feet from a crosswalk. The fine amount is consistent with other safety-related sections and is intended to be a deterrent to vehicles acting in violation of this section. Fines may take effect January 1, 2025. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$500

1336	Industrial/Commercial Annual Inspection Fee	\$125.65	The Department recommends establishing an annual fee, which will be assessed with the business license renewal, to recover the inspection costs associated with industrial and commercial stormwater compliance, pursuant to the Regional Municipal NPDES permit requirement (Part VIII.E.2). Currently, the city does not assess such a fee directly, and absorbs the cost using an on-call contract. Other nearby agencies, including the City of Los Angeles and the Los Angeles County Dept of Public Works, similarly charge for a stormwater inspection fee for NPDES compliance. The fee would recover the cost of industrial and commercial NPDES compliance and reporting requirements, including the facilities inspection. Estimated Annual Revenue: \$62,800

1337	Combined Industrial/Commercial and Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG) Annual Inspection Fee	\$175.65	The Department recommends establishing an annual fee, which will be assessed with the business license renewal, to recover the inspection costs associated with implementing the industrial and commercial stormwater compliance pursuant to the Regional Municipal NPDES permit requirement (Part VIII.E.2), in combination with the City's Fats, Oil, and Grease (FOG) Program subject to the same Regional Municipal NPDES permit and the City's Municipal FOG Ordinance (Chapter 8.14). Currently, the City performs industrial and commercial inspection requirement for facilities and does not assess such a fee directly, but rather absorbs the cost using an on-call contract. Similarly, the City does not implement a comprehensive FOG inspection program to ensure protection of the City's storm and sewer collection systems. Other nearby agencies, including the City of Los Angeles and the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, similarly charge fees for stormwater and FOG Program inspections for NPDES compliance. The fee will recover the cost of industrial and commercial NPDES compliance, Municipal FOG Ordinance, and collective reporting requirements, including facility's inspection.

The City currently offers a 7-month Cheer and Dance program from September through March as a part of its After School program, which includes recreation-level cheer and dance instruction for school-aged participants. The fee recovers the cost of a cheer uniform (top/bottom), hair bow, and pompoms for performances. Estimated Annual Revenue: N/A (program revenue is already collected within the Afterschool Program)
