I am writing to plead that you please do not put to vote a resolution regarding a unilateral Ceasefire in the war in Gaza. As a 21 year resident of the area (Altadena and La Canada) I love Pasadena and love spending time enjoying its many outdoor, retail, food and cultural offerings -- and this resolution would truly break my heart and my confidence in my elected leaders to protect minority ethnic groups in your midst.

Firstly, please understand that advocating for a ceasefire in Gaza without conditioning it on the release of the 134+ remaining hostages and the surrender of the Hamas terrorist group is immoral and unjust. Moreover it will only add to the ongoing trauma experienced by your Jewish residents and visitors who are still suffering from the impact of the ongoing crimes against humanity of October 7, the brutal war following, and the skyrocketing antisemitism everywhere we turn.

To be frank, this body does not have the expertise, charter or resources to weigh in on this complex international conflict. As has happened in cities all over the country, these resolutions become an opportunity for misinformed or even hateful folks to further spew hurtful slogans and disinformation about Israel, Jews and the conflict. As you hopefully know, on October 7, the Jewish people endured their most horrific mass slaughter since the holocaust, including atrocities that have now been verified by the UN and NY Times among others: mass rape, torturing children in front of their parents and vice versa, burning alive entire families and neighborhoods. Horrifically, many of these details came to light because they were gleefully live streamed by the terrorists themselves. Dozens of innocent people: including children, women, the elderly -- and several Americans remain in captivity as hostages in Gaza. In addition tens of thousands of Israeli citizens remain uprooted from their homes due to ongoing missile strikes from Gaza and Hezbollah in Lebanon.
