Recommendations

- 1. Find that the proposed options to recognize Troop are categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15301;
- 2. Review and select amongst four proposed options to recognize a rhythm and blues music group, *TROOP*; or
- 3. Provide alternate direction.



- Applicant Ms. Keisha Wilkins
- Recognition of rhythm & blues (R&B) group, TROOP
 - September 2023 original request to rename Catalina Avenue, Maple Street to Villa Street
 - not supported by affected residents of the block
 - > April 15, 2024 Council considered 2 street rename options
 - Dayton Street Fair Oaks to Raymond Ave
 - Morton Avenue Hammond St to Mountain
 - Directed staff to continue the public hearing and bring forth consideration of renaming Dayton Street as the only option
 - June 3, 2024 Council resolved to recognize TROOP in a meaningful way; directed staff to return with additional options



TROOP - R&B Group

- Acronym for 'Total Respect of Other People'
- Formed 1988 in Pasadena, TROOP members include:
 - > Rodney Benford; Jon Jon Harreld; Steve Russel; Allen McNeil; Reggie Warren (passed away in 2020)
- Three number-one singles and ten top-ten singles on the Billboard R&B Singles chart
- Performed at various Pasadena venues
 - > Talent shows at Pasadena high schools during formative years
 - > Practicing at Robinson Park Recreation Center for over 35 years
 - > Rose Bowl
 - > Local community functions; e.g. Northwest Renaissance in 2007





Recognition Options

Department of Public Works

September 2024 – Ms. Wilkins letter of support for consideration of the following options:

- A Renaming Dayton Street to Troop Way, between Fair Oaks Ave & Raymond Ave
- B Plaque within Central Park, corner of Fair Oaks Ave & Dayton St
- C Renaming the Dance Room at Robinson Recreation Center to Troop Room
- D Plaque on the wall of the Pasadena Civic Auditorium





Option A - Renaming Dayton Street



- TROOP practiced their dance moves at Central Park
- Jon Jon Harreld performed in Pasadena Jazz Festival
- City Street Renaming Process, with noticing guidelines in compliance with Cal. Streets & Highways Code
- Notice of June 3rd Public Hearing mailed to properties within 1000' radius and public comments collected
- Impact to delivery address for Green Hotel property, 39 E Dayton
- Subject to City Council approval



Option B – Plaque @ Central Park NW Corner



- TROOP

- Criteria & process for appropriateness per City's Public Monument Policy
 - Compatibility and impact to existing uses; liability/safety; aesthetics; maintenance
- Subject to recommendation of Recreation & Parks Commission prior to Council approval
- Design of plaque to be determined and later approved by Recreation & Parks
 Commission



Option C - Renaming Dance Room @ Robinson Recreation Center




- TROOP has practiced at Robinson Park for over three decades
- TROOP members continue to practice in the Dance Room

- Naming criteria/process per City's Public Park & Recreational Facility Naming Policy
 - Geographical location; Cultural or historical significance to neighborhood/City;
 Contribution to the community or state or country
- Notice for Public Input to property owners within 1000' radius, Dist #3 HOAs and stakeholders
- Subject to recommendation of Recreation & Parks Commission prior to Council approval



Option D - Plaque at Civic Auditorium



- Existing wall plaque honoring Eddie Van Halen, donated by Pasadena 4 Van Halen in 2021
- Similar plaque recognizing TROOP at the same location
- Criteria/process per City's Public Monument Policy
- Subject to recommendation of Recreation & Parks Commission prior to Council approval

Recreation and Parks Commission Recommendations

Department of Public Works

October 1, 2024 Commission Meeting

- Reviewed three proposed recognition options
 - Renaming [Dayton] streets not under the purview of the Recreation and Parks Commission
- Considered public input and heard public comments
 - > Robinson Recreation Center named after Mack and Jack Robinson; Renaming any rooms would diminish the magnitude and intent to honor the legendary brothers in a holistic sense
 - Petition submitted by Castle Green residents objecting to renaming of Dayton Street for historical and logistical reasons
- Unanimously recommends Option D, to install a plaque on the exterior wall of the Pasadena Civic Auditorium
 - Envisioning space can become a designated location to honor significant musical, cultural and artistic contributions
