# Independent Police Auditor Annual Report

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## Authority from PMC 2.30.020.08

- Serve as a best-practices advisor to the community police oversight commission;
- Have unimpeded access to all police department personnel complaints and investigations thereon, for auditing and reporting purposes, and, upon request and where feasible, be permitted to observe briefings received, interviews conducted, and deliberations on personnel matters including, but not limited to, use of force reviews, administrative reviews, and internal affairs reviews;
- c. Review all categorical uses of force by police department personnel to assess whether the police department's investigation into a use of force was complete, thorough, objective, and fair;
- d. Review investigations of personnel complaints of bias-based policing;
- As directed by or in conjunction with the community police oversight commission, recommend changes and additions to police department policies, procedures, and officer training;
- f. Issue public reports and give public presentations to the commission regarding police department operations, to the extent permissible under applicable law;

# Overview: IPA Services Since January 2025

- Recommendations for systemic improvement: mediation program, traffic stops/RIPA data collection
- Additional review topics as requested by CPOC Ad Hoc Committees: responses to persons experiencing crisis, review technology developments
- Community Engagement for public transparency and access

- · Strong commitment to accountability, transparency, and continuous improvement
- Collaborative and engaged with IPA and CPOC
- · Areas for continued growth
  - · Consistency and documentation of processes, consistent record-keeping
  - · Recommendations for clarifying pursuit philosophy and policy modifications
  - Tracking progress against previous audits and responding to new recommendations identified
  - Enhanced data collection and transparency in traffic stops / RIPA reporting
  - · Collaboration for new technology

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### Critical Incident Review

- Review of PPD's administrative investigation of the officer-involved shooting (OIS) of Mr. Adam Youines
  - Five recommendations related to process
  - Several repeated from prior reviews; Department "agree in concept"
- Pending cases:
  - April 14, 2024 (Mr. Andrade) incident pending criminal & admin review
  - September 7, 2025 (PPD) incident administrative review in progress

Vehicle Pursuit Review


- Attended POST-certified course offered by PPD
- Sampled ¼ (10 cases) and reviewed two cases sent to IA
  - Reviewed internal process for alignment with best practices & policy
  - Reviewed tactics for alignment with policy
- Key recommendations:
  - Opportunity to clarify a "Pursuit Philosophy" and recalibrate
  - Vehicle Pursuit policy modifications

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#### Complaint Review

- IPA may review closed complaint cases to determine if the investigation was "thorough, fair, and complete"
- Individual case review at the request of the complainant by contacting the CPOC and/or IPA directly
  - Review does not change outcome, but may inform process and/or procedure
  - Three requests to review closed complaint cases
- Planned formal review in Q2 2026

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Reviewed 15 cases: all closed
 Categorical Uses of Force from June 1,
 2024 – June 30, 2025

- Tracking progress against 2023 IPA audit
- New process and procedural recommendations identified
- Draft report under review by PPD

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# Traffic Stops / RIPA Data Collection

- Presented an overview of the survey conducted by former IPA
- Worked with CPOC Ad Hoc Committee to frame recommendations
- · Results:
  - Update policy regarding practice of "curbing"
  - Collection of data regarding curbing on RIPA form
  - Evaluate and report out on RIPA collection (generally) and practice of curbing specifically

#### Community Police Mediation Pilot Program

- Reviewed and approved PPD policy regarding mediation
- Supported CPOC staff in seeking best practices
- Framed program requirements
- RFP in process to select vendor
- Pilot plan includes evaluation metrics and reporting

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## CPOC Ad Hoc Committee Support

- Engagement with each CPOC Ad Hoc Committees on regular basis
- Highlights include:
  - Developed and approved new Rules regarding "Complaint Intake" & "Meetings with PPD"
  - Finalized pretext stop / curbing project
  - · Developing training and onboarding
  - Identifying best workflow for CPOC review of PPD policies (e.g. new technology)
  - Reviewing responses to calls for service involving persons experiencing mental health crises

#### Community Engagement

- · "Meet the IPA" events in Villa and Robinson Parks
- District Liaison meeting
- Briefing and rides with all 7 PPD Patrol teams
- "Coffee with a Cop" and Departmentsponsored events
- Meetings with key stakeholder groups, including PPOA leadership
- · Individual conversations with community members
