
Air Quality Monitoring and Testing

- South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) in burn scars and surrounding communities
 - > Stage One (Four Weeks)
 - Two mobile monitoring vehicles providing real-time data
 - Measurements of toxic metals and volatile organic compounds
 - Results will help identify locations for temporary air monitoring stations
 - > Stage Two
 - Guide deployment of temporary air monitoring stations
 - Locations based on mobile monitoring results, cleanup activity, sensitive locations, and meteorological conditions
 - Will measure particulate matter, lead, arsenic, and asbestos in communities near the burn zone



Green Waste Clean Up Progress

Over 100 Laborers + 52 Pieces of Heavy Equipment = 160+ Super-10 dump truck loads per day (6 days/week)







Phase 1 – Environmental Protection Agency

- Phase 1 Mandated Hazardous Waste Removal
 - > Reconnaissance and hazard assessment completed
 - 5 residential properties deferred to Phase 2
 - > Removal of hazardous waste has not yet been completed on any Pasadena parcels
 - > 25 EPA crews currently assigned to Eaton Fire
 - > Phase 1 completion is scheduled for end of February
 - > EPA story map available with updates and contacts



Phase 2 – U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

- Phase 2 Private Property Debris Removal
 - Right of Entry (ROE) and Opt-Out forms published on January 28th
 - > Approx. 100 ROEs and 2 Opt-Out forms have been submitted
 - County-wide ROE program has been contracted to TetraTech
 - City will develop and administer the Opt-Out program
 - > Phase 2 is estimated to be completed in 1 year
- Local Assistance
 - > Virtual technical workshop scheduled on February 5th
 - > Staff available to assist with the application
