My name is Ash Riveire, I'm a tenant in District 2 and I've lived in Pasadena for six years. I was evacuated from my apartment for three nights, and I'm very lucky that my home is still standing, but our rickety windows let in a bunch of ash and I'm sniffling and coughing even with an air purifier running. I'm disabled and this definitely can't be good for my health. I'm very concerned for my friends and neighbors who had significantly worse damage than I did and are now having to take days off work to remove the hazardous ash and soot from their homes. I'm worried partially for their health, but mostly for their housing. I don't want them to come up short on rent and risk eviction.

This fire was an absolute tragedy, and we do not need even more people to be displaced because of it. I think we need an eviction moratorium very quickly for the duration of the state of emergency. Everyone has been impacted by this in one way or another, whether their job literally burned down or if they're sheltering fire victims and that's expensive, there are a million indirect ways someone can be affected and people are going to be struggling for a while. Please do what you can to protect them so they can get back on their feet.

On the topic of the Pasadena Housing Providers— I think these people are showing you who they are right now, and you should listen. They're literally trying to get you to take rights and protections away from fire victims. I can't imagine forcing someone who lost everything out of a new home after less than a year after their last one literally burned to the ground. I think it's a completely morally bankrupt suggestion and the only thing that's actually preventing these landlords from aiding displaced people is the dollar signs in their eyes.

My name is Alex I'm a resident of Pasadena that's experienced damage to my home due to the ongoing fires. While I am incredibly lucky to not have lost my place of living (as many have) I'm still facing challenges. For example, there is smoke damage to the first floor of our house and a substantial layer of ash scattered throughout. I'm incredibly worried because I'm an at risk group (due to lung/cardiovascular issues, I also have a disability) and ash from burning homes can contain asbestos, lead, and other toxic chemicals. This is to say nothing of the horrible air quality in Pasadena lately and the unaffordable cost of air purifiers. I believe it should be out landlord's responsibility to maintain a habitable home, and I would imagine that means safe from exposure to ash and smoke.

Pasadena needs a rent freeze so tenants can have the opportunity to address these issues with our landlords. And what are landlords doing right now? Lobbying city council to make it easier to evict tenants. This is despicable behavior. Our landlord has already tried to evict us unlawfully once; my roommates and I are very worried that if we ask our landlord too many questions or bring up concerns that he will evict us. Please consider making it mandatory for landlords to respond to smoke and fire damage, make the rules clear so that we can approach our landlord with confidence and ask him to do the bare minimum.

I just want to return to my home, I've been gone for four days and the wildfire situation may get worse. Thank you for caring for those of us that are vulnerable right now.

Dear City Council,

In the tenants movement we define a tenant as someone who doesn't have control of their own housing. This group has unfortunately grown in Pasadena and Altadena this week as both tenants and long-time homeowners have lost or been displaced from their homes.

I have heard from many tenants in the past three days who have homes full of toxic ash and smoke, and whose landlords refuse to remediate it in any way in order to make the homes livable again. No doubt they are refusing repairs in hopes that their long-term tenants will leave and they can take advantage of the flooded housing market.

I myself have been displaced from my home, which was only a couple of blocks from active fire, for six days. My landlord has categorically refused to address the ash covering our door, windows, floors, or ceilings by hiring a professional inspector and remediation service. He says "Once the outside air is clear of smoke smell and ash then the inside will be fine soon." This is false, of course, as anyone who has smelled and seen Northwest Pasadena and Altadena recently can attest. In fact, two of my roommates sustained chemical burns while trying to clean the ash even while wearing long sleeves, gloves, P100 respirators, and eye goggles. We are currently paying for an airbnb to house ourselves and our cats out of our own pockets. We aren't eligible for the 211 program since our house is now "only" in an evacuation warning zone, despite it being uninhabitable. My landlord may try to go ahead and evict me when I take advantage of my right to repair and deduct.

Negligent landlords are taking advantage of the situation to get long-term tenants out. We need an immediate emergency rent freeze and eviction moratorium in the city of Pasadena to protect tenants from further displacement.

Furthermore, I urge you to reject any proposals from the "Pasadena Housing Providers" and other landlord lobby groups to temporarily weaken Article 18 using emergency powers. The last thing displaced tenants need is to be evicted again in a few months from now. The area that was burned is a historical area of Black homeownership. Landlords are saying that they want to create temporary unregulated tenancies for people "who wouldn't normally qualify", by which they mean families of color. There is no reason for landlords not to rent out their vacant units under the usual rules for robust tenant protection. If someone rebuilds their house, they will leave voluntarily and the landlords will not owe relocation assistance. If someone isn't able to rebuild, they deserve to be able to establish a long-term tenancy in their own community. This is a naked ploy to weaken tenant protections by a group that exists for the sole purpose of undermining Pasadena's new rent control program and it will create a second class of our most vulnerable neighbors with no access to legal protections.

Protecting Pasadena Homeowners and Renters After the Eaton Fire

In a tragedy of historic proportions, hundreds of people have experienced being displaced due to no fault of their own. Some have no doubt had their home insurance canceled right when they need it most. Many tenants don't have renters insurance. Across LA County there is already a discouraging amount of evidence of price gouging.

At this time, urgent action is needed to prevent a horrible situation from getting even worse. What follows are common sense policy proposals from the Pasadena Tenants Union. We have years of experience in working with tenants through crisis.

Pasadena should pass a temporary, emergency rent freeze

- No rent increases during the City of Pasadena state of emergency all units.
- Rent stabilized units are currently limited to 3% with only 1 increase per 12 months. This policy would forbid rent increase during the emergency.
- SFH, condos, and units built since 1995 should not be allowed to raise rent either, during the emergency.

Pasadena should enact an eviction moratorium (with qualifications)

- All evictions should be barred except those listed below. Non-payment of rent
 evictions should be halted as hundreds of people have lost everything. Many
 people have also lost their jobs as businesses have burned and people cannot
 get to work due to loss of personal property like cars, clothes, etc.
- If repairs are required due to fire damage, landlords must be required to make those repairs. Tenants must receive temporary relocation assistance and the opportunity to return to their units at the same rent after the repairs are completed.
- Owners of rental units should be allowed to move into a unit they own if their primary residence, or that of their family members, was destroyed by the fire.
- Evictions should be allowed for government order to vacate due to health and safety. However the tenants must be cared for in this precarious time. If the unit

can be repaired, the tenant must be guaranteed the right to return at the same rent they were paying before the fire. If not, they must receive their full relocation assistance amount.

 Relocation assistance is required for ALL no-fault evictions including those permitted under these emergency orders.

Pasadena needs to communicate clearly about price gouging prohibitions and the consequences

- The City of Pasadena should use all possible avenues to communicate with landlords and the whole business community, that price gouging is illegal and is punishable by fines and jail time.
- The City Prosecutor's office should set up an online form where residents can report illegal price gouging in Pasadena.
- The City Prosecutor should prosecute cases of price gouging.

I've been living in Pasadena until recently and I'm concerned for my friends, acquaintances, and all others still living in the area.

There are several items I think are very important right now:

- 1. Landlords must be required to make repairs due to fire damage, whether it's direct damage or indirect damage for example due to ashes getting into apartments and common areas. I've even heard of a case where it was the manager's fault that the windows were left open and they refuse to take responsibility and do the cleanup.
- 2. Tenants must receive temporary relocation assistance and be able to return after repairs are completed.
- 3. There should be **no** rent increases during the state of emergency for any units. Rent stabilized units already have some protections, but during the emergency **all** units should be protected from increases.
- 4. Pasadena also needs an eviction moratorium. It gives people extra protection while repairs are made to uninhabitable homes, it will protect those who lost employment, those who shelter fire victims, and it also helps against price gouging.

An emergency like the Eaton Fire is **not** the time to weaken tenant protections, but to strengthen them to give people some of the stability they so desperately need. A place to live is a basic need.

Thank you for your leadership during this crisis. (Thanks also to all the first responders who gave their all for us.)

This is a dire emergency.

Our Pasadena residents who were displaced by the fire and our neighbors in Altadena who suffered so much, need all the help they can get right now.

Many need housing on a temporary basis. (Many for the duration of rebuilding or relocating elsewhere). Please make it as simple as possible for those in need to find housing and make it as easy as possible for

many who may not be regular and professional rental property owners to accommodate the needs of our neighbors. Please suspend Measure H restrictions and financial obligations for those who may want to provide much needed shelter to our neighbors.

Suspending those financial obligations may also encourage professional rental property owners and managers who have been maintaining vacancies to use those units to house victims of the fire.

Being realistic, if I were faced with potential financial obligations imposed under Measure H, I would not even consider letting someone stay with me.

I am not suggesting you ignore health and building safety regulations, simply suspend those portions of Measure H that would deter someone from making space available to those in need as a result of the Eaton Fire.

Thank you for all you are doing for your constituents and our greater community.
