PPD's 2024 accomplishments lists: "Development is underway for an Active Intelligence Center (AIC)" - how can something that doesn't yet exist be an accomplishment?

*What, exactly, is this AIC (more commonly known as a Real Time Crime Center RTCC)? What does it cost? Does it align with PPD's stated goals above? NO IT DOES NOT*

There has been NO "Community engagement" regarding the definition, development, community input, feedback, or consent regarding the AIC. There should be no AIC built, and no AIC funding without PRIOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND CONSENT

How does a mass city-wide surveillance system "Enhanced quality of life" of Pasadenan's? This is not the time or place to be surveilling or infringing on the civil rights and autonomy of innocent Pasadena residents just going about their life!! What is the rationale? The Police Chief literally said that crime city-wide is down, so there isn't justification for mass surveillance on innocent residents. Enough with the hoarding of technology toys!

What, exactly, does PPD mean by emerging policing technology? Is it proven tech, that actually addresses a specific problem, and actually solves crime? There are other cities (just a few) that have this technology - spoiler alert: those cities have not rid themselves of crime!

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The new surveillance program called APD Live would give police real-time access to public and private security cameras across the City of LA.



Dubbed LAPD Live, the surveillance program would allow the LAPD to build a real-time video mosaic, access to not only its own camera feeds, but also the streams from

the department's helicopters. The department also plans to integrate its other surveillance technologies, including the predictive policing tool Compas, onto a single

If this program is implemented, the department will have real-time and in-calls buildings, retail stores, police helicopters, and officers.
