Crimes To Be Concerned About During/After An Emergency

City Attorney's/City Prosecutor's Department

- **Price Gouging** is when a seller, contractor, landlord, or individual raises the price of housing, goods, or services more than 10% after the declaration of a state of emergency.
- The City Prosecutor's Office is a member of the LA County Price Gouging Joint Taskforce Critical Fires.



Crimes To Be Concerned About During/After An Emergency

City Attorney's/City Prosecutor's Department

- Contracting without a license is always a crime, but doing so during a State of Emergency can be a felony. Please watch for anyone offering construction services and verify their contractor's license with the State Contractor's Licensing Board.
- False Impersonation of Emergency or Utility Personnel is a crime. Verify someone's identity, and when in doubt call the department to confirm this person is who they say they are.
- False representation while soliciting charitable donations
- Insurance fraud
- Financial elder abuse

Price Gouging Complaints (2025)

City Attorney's/City Prosecutor's Department

- 43 Complaints of Price Gouging in Pasadena
 - > 38 referred from Los Angeles County Department of Consumer and Business Affairs (DCBA)
 - > 4 referred from Rent Stabilization Department
 - > 1 City website contact request
- Complaints involve 33 rental units, 1 hotel, and 1 house for sale
- Complaints have been referred to PPD for investigation
