DESCRIPTION: Design phase of the Police and Fire Training Facility Reconstruction at Pasadena Civil Defense Training Center to include the layout, structure and building systems to make the space functional, safe and meet all required standards. This includes structural, architectural and design of the facility rebuild.

JUSTIFICATION: The initial design phase for the reconstruction of the Police and Fire Training Facility at the Pasadena Civil Defense Training Center is essential to develop a comprehensive and strategic plan to replace facilities lost in the Eaton fires. This phase will ensure that the proposed rebuild meets all applicable structural, architectural, and safety standards. The reconstructed facilities will provide dedicated training, storage, and office space for both the Pasadena Police Department and the Pasadena Fire Department, enabling each to meet stringent California training requirements and continue delivering best-practice public safety services to the community.

SCHEDULE: Design Phase will begin in FY 2026.

RELATIONSHIP TO GENERAL PLAN: The project is consistent with Program D-1.11 of the Safety Element, which requires the City to continue participating in regional emergency exercises, and Program S-4 which requires that the City will ensure to the fullest extent possible that, in the event of a major disaster, essential structures and facilities remain safe and functional, as required by current law. Essential facilities include hospitals, police stations, fire stations, emergency operation centers, communication centers, generators and substations, and reservoirs. Additionally, the project is consistent with Goal 2 (Land Use Diversity) of the Land Use Element, of which Policy 2.7 (Civic and Community Services) calls for providing diverse uses and services supporting Pasadena's residents such as facilities for civic governance and administration, public safety (police and fire), seniors and youth, community gatherings, and comparable activities, as well as Goal 16 (Superior Services), which calls for a superior level of services to meet the needs of Pasadena's diverse residents, including Policy 16.2 (Service Adequacy), which requires the City to periodically review the impacts of major physical, environmental, economic, and social changes and identify their implications in meeting the service needs of Pasadena's residents.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATION: Building was damaged in the Eaton Fire in 2025. The City does anticipate receiving insurance proceeds to fund the construction cost.

HISTORY: This project was created and fully funded in FY 2026.
