Item 3 on the consent agenda for tonight's (4/13) City Council meeting is a \$3.5 million contract with Motorola Solutions. Pasadena needs to stop purchasing Motorola Solutions products because of the company's long history of contracting with the Department of Homeland Security.

At the Feb. 23, 2026 City Council Meeting, the Council approved a resolution that helps take steps to mitigate impacts of ICE raids on our community. This resolution includes that the City disclose any contracts or agreements with DHS. Motorola Solutions currently has nearly \$16 million in contracts with the Department of Homeland Security, including \$15.6 for communication equipment. Between 2008 and July 2024, Customs and Border Patrol awarded Motorola Solutions over \$391.3 million worth of contracts.

The City continues to tell its residents that the City is concerned for their well-being and against the ICE raids, even going as far as partnering with the CCF to launch the community assistance fund, soliciting donations from the community. I fear that continuing to partner with companies that assist in human rights violations, both in the USA and across the world, the efforts of the city to claim they protect the well-being of its residents will fall short and seem disingenuous. Please do not partner with Motorola or other companies that assist in genocide and/or human rights violations.
