Dear Mayor and City Council,

I am writing to express my support for the safe parking program application at All Saints Church which you will be considering on March 9th, 2026.

It has been documented that safe parking programs have helped people and families transition out of homelessness more effectively and rapidly. A safe place to sleep is very important for those who are navigating this difficult period in their lives because it gives them some breathing space to reflect and assess available resources. This is a luxury they do not have in the daytime hours because they are constantly attempting to figure out next steps.

As a retired faculty member of the Los Angeles Community College District, I have experienced this first hand. When students who are homeless have a somewhat secure place for the night, the chances of them staying in school and completing the semester/program becomes significantly high. The ability to get some uninterrupted sleep helps them better focus and make rational decisions. It reduces the level of stress which is a constant in their lives. Sleeping in overcrowded shelters with a group of strangers is not always helpful for peace of mind. I am reminded of the times my students who were in one of the trades like drafting, culinary, or carpentry got robbed of their very expensive tools at a homeless shelter or sleeping on the streets. Instead of being able to complete their education and becoming gainfully employed, they ended up dropping out of school because they did not have the financial resources or assistance to replace what they had lost. However, when we were able to connect them with safe housing/parking programs, we were able to encourage them to continue their studies and explore resources to end their current crisis. Safe parking programs also traditionally provide resources to help with available housing, medical, and support services. This one-stop model is often a life saver for those who are struggling.

Those who take advantage of safe parking programs are mostly people who have fallen into homelessness recently due to financial/medical challenges. Any assistance that can be provided will help them figure out next steps and move on to live productive lives.

We are grateful that All Saints Church has generously opened their parking facilities to immediately implement this program.

We urge the City to approve this plan on March 9th. This will be a very important step in providing dignity and self respect to our neighbors who are struggling with housing insecurity.

Dear Mayor and City Council,

I am a local pastor and resident of Pasadena living in District 5.

I am writing to express my support for the safe parking program application at All Saints Church, which you will be reconsidering on March 9.

Before arriving in Pasadena, my family and I lived in Goleta, California, where we resided on the campus of a church that offered on-site safe parking. For over 8 years, my wife, two young daughters, and I experienced the joy and power of a safe parking program.

The safe parkers living on our campus ranged from older single women who were experiencing homelessness after years of trying to keep up with rising housing costs, to married women and their children who were escaping violence in their homes, to college students who were determined to meet the high expense of advanced education by reducing their rental costs. In the 8 years we were there, we witnessed the incredible power of a safe place to make dramatic differences in the lives of many women. These were important contributors to our neighborhood who were making brave decisions in order to keep themselves and their loved ones thriving in an excessively costly environment.

Along with witnessing how effective and helpful a safe parking program is for people in distress, we also formed deep relationships with wonderful people. There was no doubt that for my family and for neighbors living in this suburban coastal town, safe parkers were an important part of the community. Despite their situations of upheaval and distress, we often witnessed them contributing to local celebrations and projects, embedding themselves in the area with an empathetic tenderness that can only come from people who understand the fragility of a person's situation.

We have been delighted to learn that two churches here in Pasadena are providing this service to our community members who need a safe space to recover and find new avenues for thriving. We rejoice because we see this as a powerful indicator of this city's character. Pasadena cares for our vulnerable family and friends, Pasadena helps our neighbors in distress rise and recover. As a local Pastor living and serving on the North Lake Ave corridor, I am well aware of the challenges homelessness poses to people at risk and the complexity of finding spaces where they can rest and recover from tumultuous situations. Safe parking programs are yet another great way of helping protect members of our community from the dangers and exposure of the street.

We must protect these services as much as we can. Please approve the program at All Saints Church on March 9 so we can take meaningful steps toward reducing homelessness in Pasadena and ensure those we assist spend much less time without stable housing.

Dear Mayor and City Council,

Hello! My name is Eliot, I work in and attend church in Pasadena.

I am writing to express my support for the safe parking program application at All Saints Church, which you will be reconsidering on March 9.

In my youth I relied on Safe Parking programs to stay safe. When I was in college I worked two or three jobs and attended school full time. There were many times when I got off work late after being in class all day, and I was too tired to safely drive home. But I knew where the safe parking program churches were, and I was able to stay there.

Later in life, as a seasonally employed outdoor educator, I have lived out of my car between periods of employment.

In both of these scenarios, I was incredibly fortunate -- I knew where to access resources, and I knew that there was a definite end date to when I would be accessing them.

Even then, living out of your car for more than a month at a time can be incredibly draining.

I have also spent a handful nights at Wal Mart parking lots, or at designated Rest Stops off the 10 freeway. Without safety. Sleeping in that state -- waking up every time a car alarm goes off, or at any other loud noise -- is a different kind of sleep. It's restless. It's exhausting. It means your waking hours are more strained, the anxiety seeps into your bones.

I wanted to share my story because it is not uncommon, and as a reminder that housing instability can happen to anyone. I've experienced a lot of growth in my career over the last few years and am earning more than my parents ever did. I rent a very nice home in Toluca Lake.

But I know that 40% of Americans don't have enough saved to cover one months rent, if they suddenly find themselves unemployed. I know that medical debt continues to be crushing. I know my own student loan debt has gotten away from me.

I never doubt that I could find myself living out of my car again. So I know exactly how vital these programs are.

We also have proof that they're safe. In Pasadena, Trinity Lutheran Church has had a positive experience with their Safe Parking program. They've had no neighbors complain and no police calls.

It's my understanding that All Saints Church in Pasadena would like to host a Safe Parking program as well.

In each of the times that I lived out of my car, the time period was short -- but it was much longer than I could have survived outside. I have done a lot of tent camping in my life, as an avid hiker. But even with the considerable gear that I own (which matters -- many homeless people have next to nothing, and if they experience a sweep, they can lose everything), I would not be prepared.

Please allow All Saints to do with their property as their congregation feels called to do.

It is vital to launch these programs without delay. The All Saints program is prepared for immediate implementation once approved by the city. If another site is selected instead, approval could be delayed by years, during which individuals living in their cars might fall deeper into homelessness, ultimately requiring more complex interventions. Addressing homelessness under such conditions becomes significantly tougher, intensifying our local crisis.

The Commission on the Status of Women was established to advise the City Council on the special needs of women in Pasadena and to provide input on public policies affecting women and girls, particularly those from marginalized groups. Consistent with this mandate, **the Commission expresses its strong and unanimous support for the continuation and expansion of Pasadena's Safe Parking Program, including the proposal to establish a second Safe Parking site at All Saints Church.**

Women represent approximately one-third of unhoused adults in Los Angeles County, and in Pasadena that number approaches 40 percent.¹ Nearly 30 percent of Pasadena's unhoused population is over the age of 55 and disproportionately Black and Latino/a.² According to the 2024 Homeless Count, domestic violence is the leading cause of homelessness among women in Pasadena.³ Yet our city currently has no specialized shelter or transitional housing dedicated to women fleeing domestic violence or sexual abuse, and only one year-round shelter serving homeless adults. Combined with the severe shortage of affordable housing for low-income adults and seniors, this reality makes Safe Parking one of the most practical and cost-effective "bridge" housing options available to vulnerable women with access to a vehicle.⁴

At Pasadena's existing Safe Parking site at Trinity Lutheran Church, more than half of participants are women, most over the age of 55.⁵ This mirrors trends across Los Angeles County, where older women and survivors of domestic violence participate in Safe Parking programs at disproportionately high rates.⁶ Research consistently shows that many unhoused women feel safer sleeping in their cars than in congregate shelters, particularly those who have experienced violence or other trauma.⁷ Studies also demonstrate that Safe Parking participants

are more likely to engage in case management, maintain employment, and successfully transition into permanent housing compared to individuals living in tents or emergency overnight shelters.⁸ In short, Safe Parking is not merely a temporary solution; it is a proven pathway to housing stability.

The Commission welcomes the Mayor’s proposal to evaluate additional Safe Parking locations, including potential sites on City-owned property. However, we view this effort as an opportunity to expand capacity—not to delay or replace the proposed program at All Saints. The All Saints site would provide secure overnight accommodation for up to 25 individuals, tripling current capacity. Participants would have access to restroom facilities and on-site security during nighttime hours, when women are most vulnerable to crime and assault. Access would be controlled, limited to registered and vetted participants, ensuring safety and accountability. The program would operate in partnership with Shower of Hope to provide case management and housing navigation services designed to help participants move into permanent housing as quickly as possible.⁹

For older women, domestic violence survivors, and other vulnerable residents living in their cars, Safe Parking offers dignity, stability, and a realistic pathway out of homelessness. Expanding this program is a practical, compassionate, and evidence-based response to a documented need in our community.

The Commission respectfully urges the City Council to vote in favor of allowing the All Saints Safe Parking program to move forward.
