PUBLIC COMMENT

MR. INMAN MOORE, REPRESENTING ACT, REQUESTING COUNCIL RECONSIDER ITS PRIOR ACTION TAKEN REGARDING THE RECYCLING CENTER AT 452 NORTH LOS ROBLES AVENUE

Mr. Moore expressed concerns regarding the December 8 closure of the recycling center and requested an extension of several months to find another adequate location.

Mr. Thorgerson discussed his ideas for energy conservation and promoted use of alternative energy fuels.

Ms. Mildred Hawkins, representing the senior citizens at Pilgrim Tower East and West, expressed opposition to the recycling center and urge that it be relocated.

Mr. Robert McCordic, Pasadena resident, alleged theft of his funds by a bank in Pasadena.

Regarding public comments made pertaining to the recycling center, the Mayor noted City Council has taken action on this matter previously and had determined that the recycling center was not properly placed.

Councilmember Holden indicated the Council granted four months time for the applicant to relocate the center and noted the Council never stated that some form of a recycling center could not be operated from the current location, just not the heavy, industrial-type operation that has been existing there for some time.

The City Attorney noted a full noticed public hearing was conducted by the City Council on this matter at which time Council took final action. She cautioned Council is not in a position to consider or reconsider or rescind the action that was taken and stated if there are new or changed circumstances, the owner would need to file a new application.

In response to questions from Councilmember Gordo, the City Manager indicated staff had reviewed various locations and that one location was currently under consideration. She noted staff would continue to work with the owner.

Mayor Bogaard announced public comment would continue at the end of the meeting. He reiterated that the Council is not in a position to reconsider its decision regarding the recycling center and

that any further consideration of the current site as such would require an application to be filed.

Councilmember Madison provided a brief overview of the Predevelopment Plan for the Pasadena Conference Center expansion.

Mr. Joel Sheldon, Pasadena Center Operating Company President, and Mr. Roger Smith, Chief Executive Officer, summarized the agenda report and handout, discussed why the expansion was needed at this time, and various financing options.

Mr. Jay Goldstone, Director of Finance, responded to questions from Councilmembers regarding the loan repayment schedule.

The City Attorney noted her staff is looking into whether a business improvement district could be used in the manner being proposed as well as other means of financing alternatives.

Mayor Bogaard noted for the purposes of this discussion, it is important to remember we are talking about predevelopment, \$1 million which can be repaid and a full and unfettered opportunity

for the Council and staff to evaluate a development plan at some point in the future when it comes forward.

Mr. Michael McAlpine, of Daniel, Mann, Johnson, Mendenhall, Holmes and Narver, architectural consultants, responded to questions from Councilmember Tyler regarding the scope of the project and its feasibility.

Councilmember Holden suggested Council receive regular updates on this item.



STATEMENT OF THE CASE

The District Attorney of Los Angeles County filed an information charging appellant with felonious vehicular manslaughter (count I; Pen. Code, § 192.3(c)), felonious drunk driving (count II; Veh. Code, § 23153(a)), and felonious driving with a blood alcohol level in excess of .10 per cent (count III; Veh. Code, § 23153(b)). (C.T. pp. 127-129.) Appellant pleaded not guilty. (C.T. p. 130.)

A jury found appellant guilty of misdemeanor vehicular manslaughter in count I, and guilty as charged of felonious drunk driving in count II. (C.T. pp. 213, 214.) Dividing eleven-to-one in favor of conviction, the jury was unable to reach a verdict in count III. (C.T. p. 217.)

The court denied probation and sentenced appellant to state prison for the low term of sixteen months for drunk driving in count II. (C.T. p. 232.) The court also

imposed a jail term of one year for manslaughter in count I, but "stayed" that term permanently, in deference to the statutory proscription against "double punishment." (Ibid.; Pen. Code, § 654.)

Appellant appeals from the judgment. (C.T. pp. 234-235.)

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Appellant was driving her Renault automobile down Silver Lake Boulevard, at a speed of about 50 to 55 miles per hour, on May 15, 1984. (R.T. pp. 9-12, 17, 46, 120, 221, 236.) Although it was around 11:30 p.m., the headlights of appellant's car were dark (R.T. pp. 11, 221); and appellant failed to illuminate them even after Joe Santos, a motorist driving behind her, flashed the lights of his car as a signal to her (R.T. pp. 223, 253). Still travelling "very fast," appellant made a sharp left turn onto Parkman Avenue. (R.T. pp. 9-10, 224.)

In making the turn, appellant's car struck the left side of a Datsun being driven in the opposite direction along Silver Lake Boulevard by Gera Golden. (R.T. pp. 8-10.) The impact of the collision threw Miss Golden from her car to the street. (R.T. p. 12, 180.) Appellant's vehicle, spinning out of control, collided with some parked cars; Miss Golden's, also occupied by her mother, Gloria Golden, spun and came to rest at a traffic island. (R.T. pp. 127-129.)

As passers-by rushed to help Gera Golden (R.T. pp. 12, 180), appellant leaned against her car, smoking a

cigarette. (R.T. p. 13.) Mr. Santos, who had stopped at the scene, approached appellant and concluded that she was "drunk." (R.T. p. 229.) Oscar Medina, a companion of Mr. Santos, smelled an odor of alcohol about appellant. (R.T. p. 257.) To him, appellant did not appear to be sober. (Ibid.) Michael Bosley, Gloria Golden's boyfriend, who was summoned to the scene by Mrs. Golden, noticed that appellant was losing her balance from one moment to the next as she leaned against her automobile. (R.T. pp. 202-203.)

Two or three minutes after the collision, appellant re-entered her car as if to drive away. (R.T. p. 181.) Hilda Torres, who was tending to Miss Golden in the street, ran over and pulled the ignition keys from appellant's car. (R.T. p. 182.) Appellant stated that she was trying to move her car out of the way (R.T. p. 181), but Miss Torres could see that appellant's car was not in the way of anything (R.T. p. 182). Appellant demanded that Miss Torres return the keys, but the latter refused. (R.T. p. 182.) Noticing the alcohol odor and appellant's difficulty in maintaining her balance, Miss Torres also concluded that appellant was drunk. (R.T. p. 182.)

Soon, paramedics and police arrived at the intersection. (R.T. pp. 14, 45, 91.) Gera Golden and her mother each were transported to a different hospital. (R.T. p. 14.) Police officers Stewart Weinreb and Richard Mumford spoke with appellant at the scene. (R.T. pp. 45-46.) Appellant's eyes appeared bloodshot and glassy (R.T. p. 47);

her speech was slow (R.T. pp. 84-86) and slightly slurred (R.T. p. 130); and she smelled of alcohol (R.T. p. 46).

Officer Weinreb then conducted some "field sobriety tests." (R.T. p. 53.) Appellant proved unable to touch her finger to the tip of her nose (R.T. p. 53), or to walk heel-to-toe in a straight line (R.T. p. 55). In addition, she was unable to maintain her balance while holding one foot slightly off the ground. (R.T. pp. 56-59.) Concluding that appellant was intoxicated, Officer Weinreb placed her under arrest. (R.T. p. 58.)

At the station house, the officers tested two samples of appellant's breath in a "gas chromograph intoximeter." (R.T. pp. 59, 69.) The machine, which was working properly (R.T. pp. 275-276), reported that appellant's blood alcohol level was .15 per cent (R.T. p. 69).

A few days later -- on Mother's Day -- Gera Goldsmith was declared to be brain dead. (R.T. pp. 8, 15.) She had never regained consciousness after the collision. (R.T. p. 15.) And it was the collision that had caused her death. (R.T. p. 300.)

DEFENSE

On the evening of the accident, appellant had visited the house of friends in Venice, California. (R.T. pp. 319, 324.) While there, appellant drank two glasses of scotch-and-soda, the second one freshened with a "splash" of scotch, and one "sip" of wine. (R.T. pp. 332, 338, 399.)

Appellant departed for home about 10:30 p.m. (R.T. p. 323.) While driving, she might have turned off her headlights inadvertently, when signalling for a left turn sometime before approaching the intersection of Silver Lake and Parkman. (R.T. pp. 400-401.)

At that intersection, appellant slowed down, moved her car into the left-turn lane, and signalled with the directional light. (R.T. p. 402.) The next thing she knew, there was an "impact." (R.T. p. 402.) Appellant never saw the other car before the collision. (R.T. p. 402.)

After the accident, appellant entered her car to move it out of traffic. (R.T. p. 403.) She was not planning on leaving the scene. (Ibid.) The police "intoxilyzer" that tested her breath samples was not working properly. (R.T. pp. 349-354.)

CONTENTIONS

1. A confusing jury instruction requires reversal of appellant's drunk-driving conviction in count II. (A.O.B. pp. 31-33.)

2. The court erroneously allowed prosecution witness Joe Santos to testify that he had not been "surprised" when the collision occurred. (A.O.B. pp. 33-34.)

3. A juror's misconduct in informing the other jurors of her experience at the collision intersection requires reversal of both counts. (A.O.B. pp. 34-38.)

4. The judge improperly coerced the jurors into returning their verdict. (A.O.B. pp. 38-39.)

5.

5. The court abused its discretion in denying probation to appellant. (A.O.B. p. 40.)

ARGUMENT

I

THE JURY INSTRUCTION ON FELONY DRUNK-DRIVING WAS CORRECT

Appellant was charged, in count II, with violating Vehicle Code section 23153(a). That section provides:

"It is unlawful for any person, while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage . . . to drive a vehicle and, when so driving, do any act forbidden by law or neglect any duty imposed by law in the driving of the vehicle, which act or neglect proximately causes bodily injury to any person other than the driver."

Appellant contends that the jury instruction relevant to this drunk driving count was inadequate in that it did not make clear what conduct or which driving violations shown by the evidence could constitute the "act forbidden by law" element of the offense. (A.O.B. pp. 31-33.)1/ Under the

1. The court instructed the jury on count II pursuant to CALJIC No. 12.60:

"The defendant is charged in count II of the information with the commission of the crime of the violation of the first paragraph of section 23153 of the Vehicle Code, which provides that any person who while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage drives a vehicle and when so driving does any act forbidden by law or neglects any duty imposed by law in the driving of such vehicle, which act or negligence proximately caused bodily injury to any person other than himself and [sic]

instruction, she says, the jurors might have "bootstrapped" their way to a conviction by treating the act of appellant's drunk driving in violation of Vehicle Code section 23153 itself as the additional "act forbidden by law" or "neglect" of duty required to sustain a conviction. (A.O.B. p. 32.) Or, she asserts, they might have founded their verdict on their judgment that appellant neglected a legal duty in driving at night without headlights, even though "the prosecutor's whole case . . . [was] that the acts forbidden by law that proximately caused the accident were violations of CVC 21801(a) (failing to yield right-of-way, while making a left turn) and CVC 22350 (basic speed law)." (A.O.B. pp. 31, 33.) Appellant concludes that the instruction "should have been modified by striking out 'does any act

is guilty of the crime of the violation of the first paragraph of section 23153 of the Vehicle Code.

". . . .

"In order to prove the commission of the crime of a violation of the first paragraph of section 23153 of the Vehicle Code, each of the following elements must be proven:

"One, that a person drove a vehicle while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage;

"Two, that when so driving such person did some act which violated the law or failed to perform some duty required by the law; and

"Three, that as a proximate result of such violation of the law or failure to perform such duty another person was injured." (R.T. pp. 454-455, emphasis added.)

forbidden by law' and inserting 'violates CVC 21801(a) and/or CVC 22350.'" (A.O.B. p. 31.)

A. This Court Should Decline to Review Appellant's Claim on Its Merits

At trial, however, appellant never objected to the instruction or otherwise requested the modification she now suggests for the first time on appeal. (R.T. p. 442.) Although it is true that the appellate court "may" review the adequacy of jury instructions without a contemporaneous objection below (Pen. Code, § 1259), this Court should decline to do so in this case; for the defense lawyer who refrained from objecting below is the same lawyer now pressing the claim on appeal. This Court, that is, should not become a willing participant in such gamesmanship. (See People v. Miller (1960) 185 Cal.App.2d 59, 84.)

Refusal to review the claim would not unfairly penalize appellant for "the mistakes and ignorance of trial counsel." (People v. Wickersham (1982) 32 Cal.3d 307, 333.) If counsel's failure to object to the challenged instruction really were the product of culpable ignorance, appellant would retain an adequate, and more appropriate, remedy in habeas corpus. (See People v. Pope (1979) 23 Cal.3d 412, 426.) Because the circumstances suggest that counsel's silence at trial was deliberate in this case, however, any mistake in the instruction should be deemed an "invited error" not susceptible to review on appeal. (See People v. Wickersham, supra, 32 Cal.3d at pp. 333-335.)

B. The Instructions on Count II Were Proper

Even if this Court were to review appellant's claim on its merits, it should conclude that the instructions relevant to count II were correct. To determine the adequacy of instructions regarding an element of an offense, all the instructions must be considered as a whole, and in light of the arguments of counsel. (People v. Wright (1985) 39 Cal.3d 576, 589; People v. Bottger (1983) 142 Cal.App.3d 974, 982-983 & fn. 3 [Second Dist., Div. Five].) Here, as appellant acknowledges in her brief, "[t]he prosecutor's whole case . . . [was] that the acts forbidden by law that proximately caused the accident were . . . failing to yield the right-of-way [Veh. Code, § 21801(a)] . . . and . . . [violating the] basic speed law [§ 22350] []." (A.O.B. p. 31.)

Even if it were possible for the jury to have ignored this salient point, the challenged instruction made it clear. The instruction informed the jury that a felony drunk driving conviction required both (a) proof that the defendant drove under the influence of alcohol and (b) proof that, "when so driving," she [did] "an act forbidden by law" or "neglect[ed] any duty imposed by law." (R.T. p. 454, lines 24-28.) Because it paralleled the language of the drunk driving statute itself, the instruction was presumptively adequate. (People v. Faila (1966) 64 Cal.2d 560, 565.) Moreover, the court also reiterated the elements

of the offense in a way that emphasized that the two showings were separate:

"In order to prove . . . a violation . . . of section 23153 of the Vehicle Code . . . each of the following elements must be proven:

"One, that a person drove a vehicle while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage;

"Two, that when so driving such person did some act which violated the law or failed to perform some duty required by the law"

(R.T. p. 455, lines 13-21, emphasis added.)

Thus, especially given the obvious thrust of the People's case as identified by appellant in her brief, the plain meaning of the instructions made it clear to the jurors that a guilty verdict in count II required them to determine, not only whether appellant was under the influence when her automobile killed Gera Golden, but whether she also committed a separate culpable act that proximately caused the death.

Finally, without protest or contradiction by defense counsel, the prosecutor explained the elements of the felony drunk driving charge in a way that contradistinguished the under the influence element from potential acts "forbidden by law"; and the potential forbidden acts he mentioned were quite different in nature from simple

driving-under-the-influence.^{2/} Indeed, defense counsel in his argument tacitly adopted the prosecution's premise when he argued that the evidence did not make out the requisite independent violation of law. (R.T. pp. 533-534.)

Appellant's belated interpretation of the instruction in this appeal, a characterization wooden and implausible, cannot withstand scrutiny.

Appellant suggests that the instructions should have specified the failure-to-yield and speeding violations as the only potential "act forbidden by law" predicates for felony drunk driving liability. (A.O.B. p. 31.) But the instructions as a whole, and the argument of counsel, focused the jury's attention on these two bases for a verdict. The instructions specifically defined the failure-to-yield and speeding violations with regard to the manslaughter charge (R.T. pp. 452-454, 465), which in form closely resembled the felony-drunk-driving charge. And, as noted (see fn. 2), the prosecutor mentioned "speeding" and "unsafe left turn" among several possible predicates for a guilty verdict in count II. (R.T. p. 470.)

Appellant implies that the instruction was incorrect insofar as it might have allowed the jury to

2. The prosecutor argued: "Both of the felony drunk driving offenses require that there be a violation of the statute, a violation of law, a Vehicle Code violation, something like speeding, driving without lights, unsafe left turn, something of that nature. . . . You must believe that at the time this happened Erica Stafford Tamblyn was driving under the influence of alcohol." (R.T. p. 470.)

premise its verdict upon some violation of law other than failure-to-yield or speeding, or upon any unspecified act of culpable negligence. (A.O.B. pp. 32-33.) But there is no reason to assume that the jury, despite the parties' obvious preoccupation with the specified failure-to-yield and speeding violations, would have believed itself charged to decide the case on some other grounds. Anyway, even if, as appellant claims, the jury might have decided that appellant's conduct in driving her car at night without headlights constituted the proximate cause of Miss Golden's death, such a finding would have been a sufficient basis for a guilty verdict anyway. The negligent driving of a vehicle is itself an unlawful act sufficient to make out a violation of Vehicle Code section 23153. (People v. Oyaas (1985) 173 Cal.App.3d 663, 669-670.)

C. The Claimed Instructional Error, in Any Event, Was Harmless

Even if the challenged instruction did not adequately apprise the jurors of their duty in determining the independent "unlawful act" or "neglect" component of the section 23153 offense, the conviction nevertheless must be affirmed on grounds that the error, demonstrably, was harmless. (See Rose v. Clark (1986) 478 U.S. ___, 92 L.Ed.2d 40, 45-49; Cal. Const., art. VI, § 13.) Regardless of the jurors' treatment of that subordinate component of the felony drunk driving charge in count II, their verdict of guilt on the misdemeanor vehicular manslaughter charge in

count I proves that they necessarily found that appellant committed one of the two specified violations of law, either failure-to-yield or speeding; for the jury instructions on that count specifically described those offenses as the two possible legal violations that would support a guilty verdict. (R.T. pp. 452-454, 464-465.) Thus, the jury's verdict under unconstested and proper instructions in count I provided the finding of fact that, appellant claims, was missing from the jury's verdict in count II. That finding renders the alleged instructional infirmity in count II harmless. (People v. Seden (1974) 10 Cal.3d 703, 711.)

Appellant might argue that the jurors, in returning the count I verdict, relied upon the "negligent act" theory, rather than the "unlawful act" theory, so that their verdict does not necessarily supply the allegedly uncertain "act forbidden by law" finding in count II. But -- even assuming such a finding of negligence would not itself establish the "unlawful act" requirement (see People v. Oyaas, supra, 173 Cal.App.3d at pp. 669-670; People v. DeSpensa (1962) 203 Cal.App.2d 283, 290-291) -- the record nevertheless establishes, even under the most stringent "beyond a reasonable doubt" standard of harmless-error review, that the jurors must have determined that a failure-to-yield violation on appellant's part proximately caused Miss Golden's death.

The People's evidence showed that appellant -- while drunk, speeding, and driving at night without headlights -- smashed into the driver's side of the victim's

car under circumstances making it manifest that appellant had failed to yield to oncoming traffic in making a left turn. (See Veh. Code, § 23801(a); R.T. p. 454.) Indeed, even the defense evidence established that appellant had failed to yield; for, by appellant's own testimony, she made the left turn and immediately collided with the victim's car in the intersection. (R.T. p. 402.) With respect to this undisputed collision in the course of the left turn, the only material issues raised by the defense evidence were (1) whether appellant was driving under the influence of alcohol at the time and (2) whether appellant, in making the turn, had adverted to the danger to a degree that revealed her conduct to be grossly, and thus feloniously, negligent. The evidence, then, absolutely resisted any conclusion inconsistent with a finding that appellant's failure to yield proximately caused the victim's death. The jurors' misdemeanor-manslaughter verdict, if indeed based upon a finding that appellant had caused the victim's death negligently (R.T. pp. 464-466), therefore entailed a finding that appellant had negligently failed to yield the right of way, conduct that necessarily amounted to a violation of Vehicle Code section 21801(a). The jury's provably implicit finding with regard to this violation of law in count I compensates exactly for the alleged error in the count II instructions. So, when judged against either of the two available standards of prejudice -- i.e., whether a federal constitutional error was "harmless beyond a reasonable doubt"

(see Rose v. Clark, supra, 478 U.S. at p. ___, 92 L.Ed.2d at p. 49), or whether an ordinary error likely cost the defendant a more favorable result (see People v. Watson (1956) 48 Cal.2d 818, 836) -- the alleged error in the felonious drunk driving instructions in count II must be deemed harmless.

II

THE CONDUCT OF JUROR DELGADO DID NOT PREJUDICE APPELLANT

Juror Tina Delgado, whose boyfriend happened to drive her through the intersection, briefly and inadvertently saw the scene of the crime one night during the period of jury deliberations. (R.T. p. 578.) Shortly, after the deliberating jury had obtained a second viewing of a videotape of the scene (Def. Exh. G; R.T. pp. 569-570), Ms. Delgado "supplemented" what she believed the videotape had shown by remarking that, in her experience, the intersection indeed had been flat. (R.T. pp. 578, 596.) Appellant argues that juror Delgado's conduct gave rise to an unrebutted presumption of reversible error. (A.O.B. pp. 34-38; see People v. Honeycutt (1977) 20 Cal.3d 150, 156.) But, although the juror certainly made a mistake, an appropriate examination of the "entire record to determine whether there is a reasonable probability of actual harm" resulting from the juror's actions serves to rebut any presumption of prejudice in this case. (Hassan v. Ford Motor Co. (1982) 32 Cal.3d 388, 417, emphasis added; people v.

Sassounian (1986) 182 Cal.App.3d 361-399-400; People v. Diaz (1984) 152 Cal.App.3d 926, 935.)

Any prejudice was rebutted, first, by the trial judge's admonition to the jury:

"It's come to the attention of the court that Juror No. 12, Ms. Delgado, apparently lives close to the scene of the alleged crime, and has inadvertently driven through that intersection, and thereafter shared with the jury some of her opinions regarding that intersection or the street immediately before the intersection. [¶] I want all of the jurors to disregard anything that Ms. Delgado may have said concerning that subject."

(R.T. p. 600.)

Appellant says the judge should have asked the jurors whether Ms. Delgado's information affected their deliberations. (A.O.B. p. 35.) But, immediately after admonishing the jurors to disregard Ms. Delgado's remarks, the judge asked them, "Will you promise me that you will do that?" (R.T. p. 600.) As the record reflects, "The jury responded in the affirmative." (Ibid.) This inquiry surely was the equivalent of the question appellant says the judge ought to have asked.

A further indication that the judge's inquiry was adequate lies in the fact that defense counsel, now counsel on appeal, never suggested the voir dire he now champions on appeal. Moreover, counsel never accepted the judge's offer

to provide all twelve jurors with a view of the scene, to neutralize any untoward effect of Ms. Delgado's remarks. (R.T. p. 597.) Indeed, by his own admission, counsel never even obtained a ruling on his motion for mistrial on the basis of juror misconduct.^{3/} Counsel's actions -- if insufficient to amount to an outright abandonment of his juror misconduct challenge on appeal (see People v. Obie (1974) 41 Cal.App.3d 744, 750) -- at least suggest it was apparent at trial that the court's response to the juror problem was adequate.

Moreover, the overwhelming evidence of appellant's guilt rendered the nature of the juror's conduct immaterial and neutralized the seriousness of it. (Cf. People v. Sassounian, supra, 182 Cal.App.3d at p. 399, and cases cited therein.) As noted in argument I, there could be no serious question that appellant's left turn was the proximate

3. The record shows that counsel made a mistrial motion after Ms. Delgado first described her activities (R.T. p. 581); but the judge, partially because the trial prosecutor was unavailable to respond, said he would "take that motion under advisement and give it some thought[¶] The matter is denied without prejudice at this time. You can renew it, and I think we ought to get [the prosecutor] back." (R.T. p. 583.)

The next day, with the prosecutor having returned, defense counsel in chambers noted his motion for a mistrial again. (R.T. pp. 587, 598.) The court responded, "Well, you may renew your motion at the morning session, Mr. Cheroske[¶] If the motion is renewed, you have a motion, you will have a chance to argue on the record." (R.T. p. 599.) At the morning court session, the judge admonished the jury to disregard Ms. Delgado's remarks (R.T. p. 600); but defense counsel never renewed his motion in court and, as he later conceded after trial, "the request was made for a mistrial, and there was never any ruling on that." (R.T. p. 617.)

result of the victim's death. The only material issues at trial, in reality, were (a) whether appellant was intoxicated and (b) whether her conduct was grossly negligent or merely negligent. The shape of the intersection had no bearing on the question of appellant's drunkenness. And, despite the overstatement in appellant's brief (A.O.B. p. 35, lines 21-25), evidence of the contours of the intersection bore, not on the existence of negligence, but only on the level of negligence. That is, it is hard to imagine how any urban intersection could be contoured in a way that would make it so difficult to see oncoming traffic that one could, without advertent to the danger, strike the driver's side of an oncoming car in the middle of the intersection. In any event, as the videotape in Defense Exhibit G shows, the intersection in question in this case could not rationally be deemed so outrageously dangerous as to give rise to a serious question of whether appellant even had been "ordinarily" negligent at all. The jury, apparently compromising with one holdout juror, resolved the negligence in appellant's favor, by finding only simple negligence in the manslaughter charge. Thus, Ms. Delgado's remarks did not cause appellant any "actual harm."

III

THE COURT PROPERLY ALLOWED PROSECUTION WITNESS JOE SANTOS TO TESTIFY THAT THE COLLISION DID NOT SURPRISE HIM

Prosecution witness Joe Santos, whom appellant overtook in her car immediately before the fatal collision,

testified over defense objection that he was not "surprised" at the collision between appellant's and Ms. Golden's automobiles. (R.T. pp. 226-227.) Mr. Santos, who had testified that had observed appellant start to turn while Ms. Golden was approaching in the opposite direction (R.T. p. 225), explained why he was not surprised: "It looked so -- it looked positive. I don't know -- trying to come up with the word. It looked so -- I just knew if the car at the speed that they were going, if she was going to turn or if the car was going to turn, they were going to collide." (R.T. p. 227.)

Appellant contends that Mr. Santos' testimonial claim that he had not been "surprised" by the collision constituted an inadmissible opinion by a non-expert. (A.O.B. p. 33.) But, to the extent that Mr. Santos' averred lack of "surprise" was tantamount to an "opinion" that the accident was likely to occur, his full testimony on the issue established that such an "opinion" was "rationally based upon [his] perception," and helpful to a clear understanding of his testimony regarding the relative positions and speeds of the two cars. Thus, his "opinion" was admissible, as an exercise of the trial court's broad discretion to admit evidence, under Evidence Code section 800.

Even if appellant could meet his heavy burden of demonstrating that the court's ruling was so irrational as to constitute an abuse of discretion, any error in admitting the opinion testimony would prove harmless. Although Mr. Santos'

opinion was helpful to a better understanding of his testimony, the significance of his testimony on this point lay in the fact that he was able to see, from a vantage behind appellant's car, the very approach of the victim's automobile that, the defense implied, might have been obscured by the configuration of the intersection. Appellant does not suggest that Mr. Santos' direct account of his own observations in this regard was inadmissible. Given Mr. Santos' damaging testimony, any error in receiving his "opinion" that he was not "surprised" by the collision could not likely have cost appellant a better result at trial. (See Cal. Const., art. VI, § 13; Evid. Code, § 353; People v. Watson, supra, 48 Cal.2d at p. 836.) This conclusion is buttressed further by the fact that the jury apparently deemed appellant's conduct in making the turn to be merely negligent and not grossly so.

IV

THE COURT DID NOT "COERCE" THE VERDICT

Appellant argues that the court -- by telling the jurors that they must try to resolve the case and by allowing deliberations to continue after the lone holdout juror for a "not guilty" verdict on the felony manslaughter count had accused his fellow jurors of badgering him -- improperly "coerced" the verdict. (A.O.B. pp. 38-39.) The judge's instructions about the jurors' duties, however, were correct; and his decision to let them continue their deliberations was proper.

On the third day of their deliberations, the jurors reported that they were divided eleven-to-one on count I, but had not even considered the "lesser included" offense option in that count, or either of the two remaining drunk-driving counts. (R.T. pp. 576-577.) Without any objection from defense counsel, now counsel on appeal, the court instructed the jurors as follows:

"Both the People and the defendant are entitled to the individual opinion of each juror. It is the duty of each of you to consider the evidence for the purpose of arriving at a verdict, if you can do so.

"Each of you must decide the case for yourselves, but should do so only after a consideration of the evidence and instructions with the other jurors.

"By 'discussion,' we mean a fair and open-minded discussion. You should not hesitate to change an opinion if you are convinced it is erroneous. And the key to that phrase, if you are convinced. I am speaking of every individual juror.

"However, you should not be influenced to decide any question in a particular way because a majority of the jurors or any one of them favors such a decision.

"Now, that's the position that the jurors must take in resolving this case. We need each of your individual opinions. You will have the benefit of argument and consultation with other jurors. If you are convinced your opinion is in the majority, sobeit. If you cannot be convinced, sobeit, but we insist you make an effort to resolve differences, and that effort be open-minded and with fair consideration of all the evidence.

"Once you have reached that point you have concluded your duties as jurors." (R.T. p. 580, emphasis added.)

With minor differences as to form, this instruction was commended as proper by the State Supreme Court in People v. Gainer (1977) 19 Cal.3d 835, 856. (See CALJIC No. 17.40.) Appellant, however, says that the instruction -- insofar as it stated "we insist you make an effort to resolve differences" -- ventured beyond what the Gainer Court commended into the territory that the Gainer Court condemned. (A.O.B. p. 38.) But he does not explain why. The challenged portion does not differ in any significant way from the admonition that "[i]t is the duty of each of you to consider the evidence for the purpose of arriving at a verdict if you can do so" -- the language of the instruction specifically approved in Gainer. The challenged portion merely explained again that the jurors must try to reach a verdict fairly and reasonably. Especially in the absence of any explanatory

argument in appellant's brief, there is no reason to conclude that the challenged instruction was improper.

Appellant further argues, it appears, that the court should have declared a mistrial the morning of the fourth day of deliberations. That morning, the foreman reported that the jurors, apparently still divided eleven-to-one on the felony manslaughter charge, still had not voted on the "lesser included offense" option and had taken only "preliminary" votes on the two drunk driving counts. (R.T. p. 600.) Also, the apparent holdout juror communicated his claim that the other jurors had been "badgering" and "belittling" him. (R.T. p. 589.) The court told the jury to consider the "lesser offense" option on count I. (R.T. p. 601.) Eighty-three minutes later, the foreman reported a deadlock as to all counts, and inquired about the resolution of the holdout's recent request to be discharged from the jury for medical reasons. (R.T. pp. 602-604.) The court told the jury to continue deliberations, explaining that the apparent holdout juror appeared able to discharge his duties and cautioning all the jurors not to "intimidate" him. (R.T. p. 604.) Immediately before noon that day, the foreman reported that the jury was continuing to deliberate. (R.T. p. 605.) At four o'clock, the jury returned unanimous verdicts that appellant was guilty of the lesser misdemeanor offense in count I and was guilty as charged of felony drunk driving in count II. (R.T. p. 606.)

At no time during these proceedings did defense counsel, now counsel for appellant on appeal, request a mistrial or any action on grounds of alleged coercion of the holdout juror. Instead, as noted earlier, counsel moved for a mistrial only on grounds that a different juror, Ms. Delgado, had committed misconduct. (R.T. pp. 598-599.) He should not now be heard to complain about the trial court's decision. (See People v. Rogers (1978) 21 Cal.3d 542, 547.)

Even if this Court were to consider appellant's belated claim, it should be rejected on its merits. Whether to discharge an allegedly deadlocked jury is a decision within the discretion of the trial judge (Paulson v. Superior Court (1962) 58 Cal.2d 1, 6), whose decision is not to be overturned "unless there is a strong showing of a manifest miscarriage of justice and no possibility for differing opinions on the facts (People v. Ham (1970) 7 Cal.App.3d 768, 775).

In this case, the court's decision did not result in any "manifest" injustice. Indeed, it appears that it was the minority juror who succeeded in bringing the others around to a more lenient misdemeanor verdict on count I. In recognition of this fact, appellant in his brief seems to concede that he is not entitled to a reversal on that count at all. (A.O.B. p. 39.)

More important, sound reasons mandate the conclusion that the court's decision to allow the jury to

deliberate through the day was appropriate. First, as noted above, neither party objected to it. Second, the jurors only that day had begun to consider the "lesser" offense in count I and the charged offenses in counts II and III. Third, the jurors had not been deliberating an inordinately long time without result, especially given the fact that they were still in the process of reviewing the defense's videotape exhibit on the first day of what turned out to be only four days of deliberations. Appellant's claim that his jury was "coerced," therefore, should be rejected.

V

ANY FAILURE TO STATE REASONS FOR
DENYING PROBATION WAS HARMLESS

Appellant, last, argues that the court erroneously imposed a state prison sentence on count II without stating a specific reason for that decision. (A.O.B. p. 40.) The California Rules of Court, of course, require such a statement of reasons. (Cal. Rules of Court, rules 439(d), 443.) Even though the court in this case did not state any reason for denying probation, however, the sentence nevertheless should be upheld.

The only real issue at the sentencing hearing was whether the court should grant probation or sentence appellant to prison for the low term. That was the exclusive subject of recommendations and arguments of counsel (R.T. pp. 625-629), and it apparently accounted for the trial court's decision to obtain a diagnostic study of appellant

from the Department of Corrections (R.T. pp. 618-620). In sentencing appellant to prison for the low term, then, the court necessarily determined that the nature, circumstances, and seriousness of the crime -- involving the death of a young lady at the hands of a drunk driver -- outweighed the considerations favorable to appellant. Because the trial court resolved that specific issue exclusively, a remand for a formal statement of reasons would amount to nothing more than "slavish adherence to ritualistic formula." (People v. Blessing (1979) 94 Cal.App.3d 835, 839.) Any error, therefore, should be deemed harmless. (See ibid.; People v. Romero (1985) 167 Cal.App.3d 1148, 1151; People v. Lambeth (1980) 112 Cal.App.3d 495, 501.)

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, respondent respectfully requests that the judgment of conviction be affirmed.
