SUBJECT: RECOGNIZE REVENUE FROM THE FIFTH CYCLE (2ND YEAR) USED MOTOR OIL RECYCLING BLOCK GRANT AWARD #UBG5-96-2092 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$46,072 FROM THE CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the California Integrated Waste Management Board to promote enhancement of used motor oil recycling projects in the City of Pasadena.
2. Approve a journal voucher recognizing and appropriating \$46,072 in revenues from the State of California Integrated Waste Management Board to Account #6461, Fund #406, Organization #764140, Project #93000, the Fifth Cycle (2nd Year) Used Motor Oil Recycling Block Grant.

BACKGROUND

On March 3, 1997, the City Council approved submittal of a grant application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) for the fifth grant cycle of the Used Motor Oil Block Grant (City of Pasadena Resolution Number 7470).

On June 30, 1997, the City of Pasadena was notified that the application for the promotion and enhancement of used motor oil recycling projects was approved for funding in the amount of \$48,917 for the first year of a three year grant. Please note on the accompanying grant agreement form, the CIWMB encumbers its funds the fiscal

year prior to the year that they are awarded to the City. On May 28, 1998, the City of Pasadena was notified that \$46,072 was awarded for the second year. Monies were awarded as follows for this three-year grant:

CIWMB FY1996/97	\$48,917	for use in FY1997/98
CIWMB FY1997/98	\$46,072	for use in FY1998/99
CIWMB FY1998/99	\$46,614 (tentative)	for use in FY1999/2000

Agenda reports will be prepared for the City Council annually to recognize the revenue for used motor oil recycling.

The CIWMB oversees the State of California's motor oil deposit program, whereby an additional \$0.04 per quart is charged to motor oil consumers. Unclaimed redemption monies are used to provide grant funds to municipalities for promoting used motor oil recycling programs.


According to the grant requirements, "all claimed costs to be funded by grant funds must be clearly related to implementation and operation of a local used oil collection program." The Street Maintenance and Integrated Waste Management Division qualifies in that it offers curbside collection of used motor oil and also has ten (10) State-certified oil collection centers within the City of Pasadena. The City will utilize the grant to enhance and expand the existing used motor oil program by continuing public education and outreach.

The grant funds expire June 30, 1999.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total Fifth Cycle (2nd Year) Used Motor Oil Recycling Block Grant award is \$46,072 for the current fiscal year. This action by City Council increases FY99 Refuse Collection Fund revenues and appropriations in Account #6461, Fund #406, Organization #764140, Project #93000, the Fifth Cycle (2nd Year) Used Motor Oil Recycling Block Grant, by \$46,072.




