SUBJECT: Transfer of M.T.D. 1526 Storm Drain  
Facility (Oak Knoll Avenue Storm Drain)  
to Los Angeles County Flood Control  
District

## RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council adopt a resolution by at least a six-sevenths vote (Section 28-13 $\frac{3}{4}$  of the Water Code requires a four-fifths vote) requesting the Los Angeles County Flood Control District to accept transfer of Miscellaneous Transfer Drain No. 1526 (Oak Knoll Avenue Storm Drain), and authorizing the City Manager to execute all necessary documents to effectuate said transfer.

## BACKGROUND:


Construction was completed in October 1997 on M.T.D. 1526, a storm drain in Oak Knoll Avenue from Old Mill Road to Huntington Garden Drive.

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Works, on behalf of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District, will maintain this facility provided that it is transferred to the County. In order for the transfer to occur, it is necessary that the City Council adopt a resolution by at least a six-sevenths vote (Section 28 - 13 $\frac{3}{4}$  of the Water Code requires a four-fifths vote) requesting the County to accept transfer of this drain for operation, maintenance, repair, and improvement, and authorizing the City Manager to execute all necessary documents to effectuate said transfer.


FISCAL IMPACT:

There will be no cost to the City for this transfer. The transfer of this storm drain to the Los Angeles County Flood Control District will spare the City from future responsibility for its maintenance and repair.




