Re: AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES SHERIFF DEPARTMENT FOR SUPPLEMENTAL LAW ENFORCEMENT

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. It is recommended that the City Council authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract with the County of Los Angeles Sheriff Department to provide supplemental law enforcement services to the City of Pasadena for New Year's activities for up to three years at a cost not to exceed \$450,000 per year. The proposed contract is exempt from Competitive Bidding pursuant to City Charter section 1002(H) and the Affirmative Action in Contracting Ordinance pursuant to section 4.09.060(A)(3), contracts with other governmental agencies.
2. It is also recommended that the City Council authorize the City Manager to extend this contract for two additional years.

BACKGROUND:


In order to provide adequate law enforcement for the City's New Year's activities, it is necessary to supplement the City's police department with personnel and equipment provided by the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department. This contract will provide the City with supplemental law enforcement personnel and motor vehicles, as well as clerical and support assistance as deemed necessary by the police chief. The Pasadena Police Department and the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department estimate that the total cost shall not exceed \$450,000 per year.

Staffing levels are determined by reviewing the activity levels of past years, anticipated enforcement actions and changes in the overall structure of the event. Current events and intelligence information related to the parade and its participants may also effect staffing levels. The resources necessary to provide an adequate level of security cannot be attained elsewhere at a comparable cost.


FISCAL IMPACT:
