APPROVAL AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 6834 CONCERT DATES:

CHANGING SEPTEMBER 16 TO 17 AND OCTOBER 1 TO 2, THE

DELETION OF SEPTEMBER 27, AND THE ADDITION OF OCTOBER 7, 2000 TO BE HELD IN THE GOLD SHELL AT

MEMORIAL PARK AND REPORT ON SEPTEMBER 7 AND 8, 2000

PASADENA LIVE CONCERTS

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

- 1. First reading to amend Ordinance No. 6834 suspending the Noise Ordinance at Memorial Park concert dates: changing September 16 to 17 and October 1 to 2, the deletion of September 27, and the addition of October 7, 2000, and;
- Approve a Journal Voucher appropriating an additional \$10,000 to the Memorial Park Master Plan Capital Improvement Account (78453).

BACKGROUND:

At the August 7, 2000 City Council meeting the Council approved the preparation of an agreement and authorized the City Manager to enter into same with Pasadena Live, LLC to receive \$104,550 and such additional amounts as may be required to fund the improvements to Memorial Park. The costs are to include a contract project manager to insure that the City is not at risk for successful completion of the improvement program. The amount was an advance of license fees for the proposed events.

The date changes of September 16 to 17 and October 1 to 2, the deletion of September 27, and the addition of October 7, 2000 were requested by the Promoter. The Promoter has confirmed that there will be no further date additions and/or changes.

The \$10,000 cost increase from \$104,550 to \$114,550 was mutually agreed upon to cover such things as the services of a full time Construction Manager hired by the City to handle the construction obligations as outlined in the contract.

At the August 7, 2000 Council meeting two concerts were approved, Thursday, September 7 and Friday, September 8, 2000. Staff has been instructed to report back to the City Council at the September 11, 2000 meeting with the following information: 1) the fiscal impact to the City, 2) the environmental impact to the Community, and 3) the revenues realized by Pasadena Live, LLC.

As the results of the first two concerts on September 7 and 8, 2000 will not be available from the Promoter until Monday, September 11, 2000, it is not possible to include same as a part of this Agenda Report. It is anticipated that the information will be available for distribution to the Council at the September 11, 2000 Council meeting.
